

Joint International Policing Hub

“1. What is the remit and mandate of the JIPH?”

The JIPH will ensure that the UK has an international policing capability that is able to identify, prioritise, develop and deliver upon non-operational international policing requirements and requests in line with government priorities and according to need.

The JIPH and International Co-ordination Committee (ICC) will bring policing, law enforcement and government together for the first time to form the single gateway for domestic and global stakeholders to access UK international policing. Initially this will focus on non-operational policing assistance.

“2. What is the organisational structure of the JIPH?”

The project is currently being administered by the Stabilisation Unit. The JIPH is housed alongside the National Police Co-ordination Centre with oversight governance provided by the National Police Chiefs' Council ICC.

“3. Who occupies the management positions of the JIPH?”

The Strategic Police Adviser for the Stabilisation Unit heads the JIPH on behalf of the National Police Chiefs' Council lead for international policing, Chief Constable Andy Marsh.

“4. From what date did the JIPH come into effect?”

The JIPH has not yet been formally launched. However, a 'soft launch' took place on 2nd November 2015 in order to set up infrastructure and implement and test processes.
