Your correspondence dated 4 September 2015 has been considered to be a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000. You requested the following information:

Please can you tell me what proportion of the defence budget was allocated for 2013/14 and 2015/16 for the front line commands; Army, Navy and Air and a break down of how these monies were spent. I am particularly interested in what was spent/is ear marked for equipment procurement for the three services.

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that no information in scope of your request is held.

Under Section 16 of the FOIA, public authorities are required to provide advice and assistance while processing FOI requests, and I have therefore included some additional information below that you may find useful.

The MOD does not hold the precise information that you have requested. The budgetary structure of the MOD does not show separately the costs or budgets of the three individual Armed Services. This is because large parts of the Armed Services operate as fully integrated joint organisations in which elements from the Navy, Army and Air Force work closely together and share land, buildings and facilities, and sometimes equipment.

The Defence Statistics organisation publishes a wealth of information about defence spending. Most of this is available from the MOD statistics website which you can access using the following link:

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
