- 1. How many current applications for PIP are being processed.
- 2. How many cases are currently in the hands of Capita awaiting a submission to DWP
- 3. What percentage of applications are rejected.
- 4. What is the percentage of successful appeals.
- 5. How long on average does the complete process from application to appeal heard take.
- 6. How many rejected cases have been successful with new applications.

DWP response

Personal Independence Payment (PIP) started from April 2013 and although limited data has started to feed through, we need to wait until the Department has quality assured, meaningful figures for publication. The Department is working to guidelines set by the UK Statistics Authority to ensure we are able to publish statistics that meet high quality standards at the earliest opportunity. We intend to publish official statistics on PIP from Spring 2014.

An ad-hoc release of PIP management information was published on 11 February 2014 which covers the volumes of PIP new claims registered and decisions made between April 2013 and December 2013, and the award rates for decisions made. Breakdowns for new claims not made under the Special Rules for Terminally III people and new claims made under the Special Rules for Terminally III people are also given.
