### HS2 PLANNING FORUM: WRITTEN STATEMENTS AND DESIGN AND ACCESS STATEMENTS

### Introduction

- 1. Planning Forum Note (PFN) [X] sets out the content of submissions under Schedule 17 of the High Speed Rail (London West Midlands) Act (the Act). Paragraph 3 of PFN [X] indicates that a written statements will be prepared by the nominated undertaker. The written statement will be provided for information only and will contain descriptive text to help the local planning authority to determine the request for approval.
- 2. The purpose of this note is to establish the structure and contents of the written statement and design and access statement that will accompany Schedule 17 requests for approval (under paragraphs 2, 3 and 4 of Schedule 17), and to establish the structure and content of a design and access statement, which would be submitted with a Schedule 17 request for approval as appropriate.

## **Content of Schedule 17 Written Statements**

- 3. Plans and Specifications (para. 2 and 3 of Schedule 17) and Construction Arrangements (paragraph 4 of Schedule 17) submissions may be made concurrently for the same work. Separate written statements will be produced for each request for approval.
- 4. The scope of the content of the written statement will reflect the scope of the matters for approval. Certain sections of the text to be included in the written statement will be standard for all requests for approval in particular the text within the introduction, some of the programming (i.e. project-wide information) and design criteria. Where a design and access statement is to be submitted, architectural design criteria and rationale will not be included in the written statement as this will be included in the design and access statement.

## **Plans and Specifications**

5. The following table sets out the structure and contents of a written statement for a Plans and Specifications request for approval under Schedule 17:

Location and characteristics of the Area	Description of land uses, main geographical features, main environmental characteristics, highway network.
Description of the Works	Outlines the works, describes the main features, lists the works for approval under the relevant section of the Act.
Design Criteria and Rationale	<ul> <li>Outlines the design options analysed during the production of the design including:</li> <li>An explanation to support the design option(s) chosen.</li> <li>An explanation of the constraints on the design.</li> </ul>
Programme and Sequence of Works	A high level description of the programme for the works and how they fit into the programme for other works in the area.

Other main consents associated with the	<ul> <li>Identification of any other main consents associated with the work such as highways or water.<sup>1</sup></li> </ul>

# **Matters Ancillary to Development (Construction Arrangements)**

6. The following table sets out the structure and contents of a written statement for a Construction Arrangements (paragraph 4 of Schedule 17) request for approval under Schedule 17:

Introduction	<ul> <li>Introduces the Project, the HS2 approvals regime under Schedule 17 and the requirements placed on the nominated undertaker.</li> <li>Outlines the purpose of the document, the submission it is part of, and the works for approval.</li> <li>Sets out the statement's structure.</li> </ul>
Location and characteristics of the Area	Description of land uses, main geographical features, main environmental characteristics, highway network
Description of the Construction Arrangements	<ul> <li>Outlines the arrangements, description of the main features, lists the arrangements for approval under the relevant section of the Act.</li> <li>This will include any relevant constraints.</li> </ul>
Programme and Sequence of Works	A high level description of the programme for the works and how they fit into the programme for other works in the area.
Other main consents associated with the work	Identification of any other main consents associated with the work such as highways or water. <sup>2</sup>

## **Design and Access Statements**

- 7. A design and access statement (DAS) will accompany, for information the Plans and Specifications requests for approval under Schedule 17 for Key Design Elements<sup>3</sup>. As the DASs will be to assist with the determination of requests for approval under Schedule 17 the content set out below reflects the scope if the planning regime and matters that might be covered in a DAS for a planning application will not be covered in the DAS for HS2 works.
- 8. The design and access statements will generally follow the structure set out below. The contents of the DAS submitted with requests for approval will address issues related to the relevant grounds specified in Schedule 17 (paragraph 1(5)). The structure will be as follows:-
