Thank you for your email of 12 January requesting the following information; "a list of customers who the water suppliers serve in the Feltham residents and the number of houses that are being served by the water suppliers on the Ordnance close."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed by The Ministry of Defence and we can confirm that some of the information, within the scope of your request, is held.

The request for information regarding the list of customers served by the water suppliers within the Feltham residents, falls entirely within the scope of the absolute exemptions provided for at sections 40 (Personal Data)

Section 40(2) has been applied to some of the information in order to protect personal information as governed by the Data Protection Act 1998. Section 40 is an absolute exemption and there is therefore no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold the information.

However under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to note that there are 37 houses on Ordnance Close that are being served by the water suppliers.

Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
