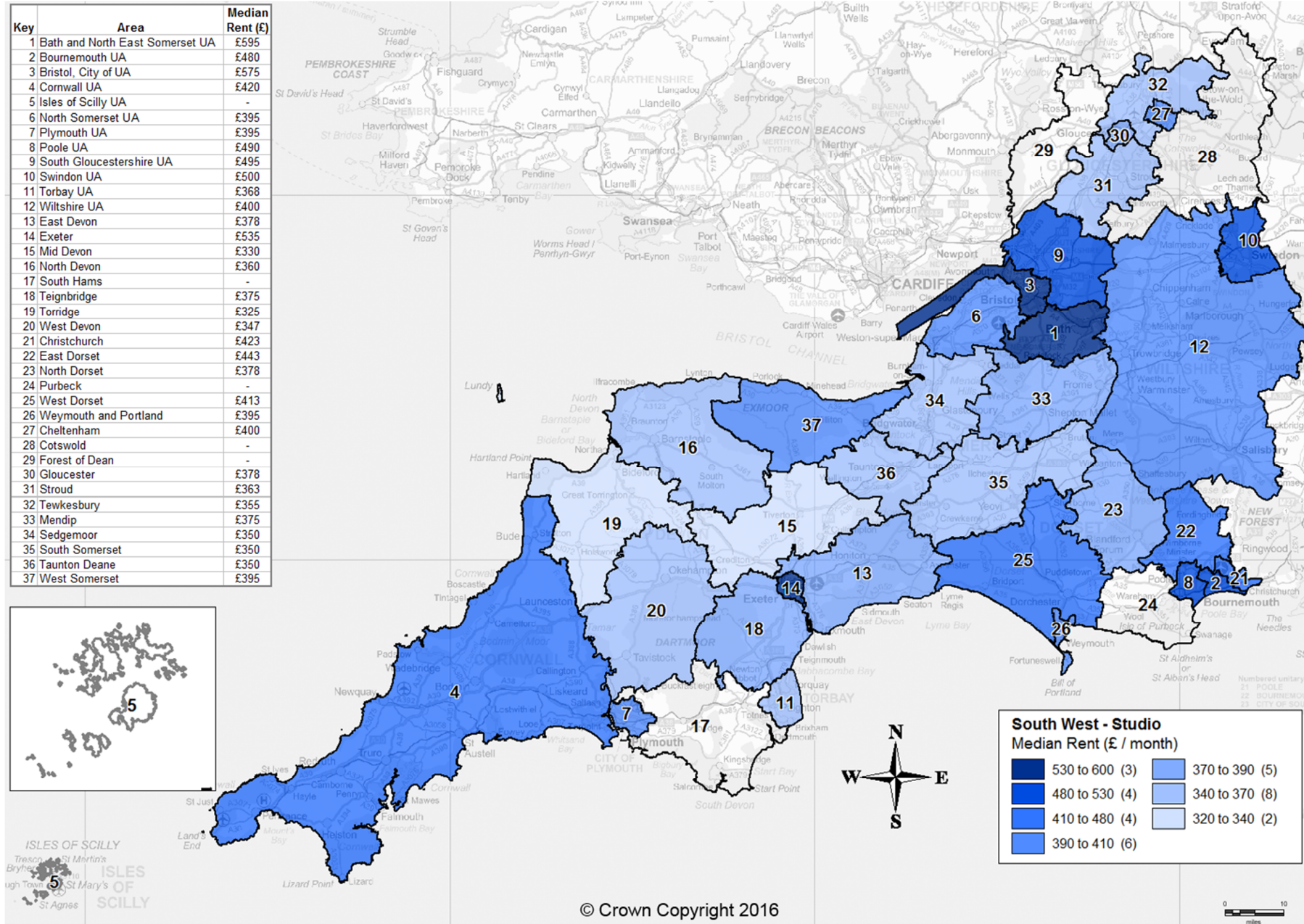

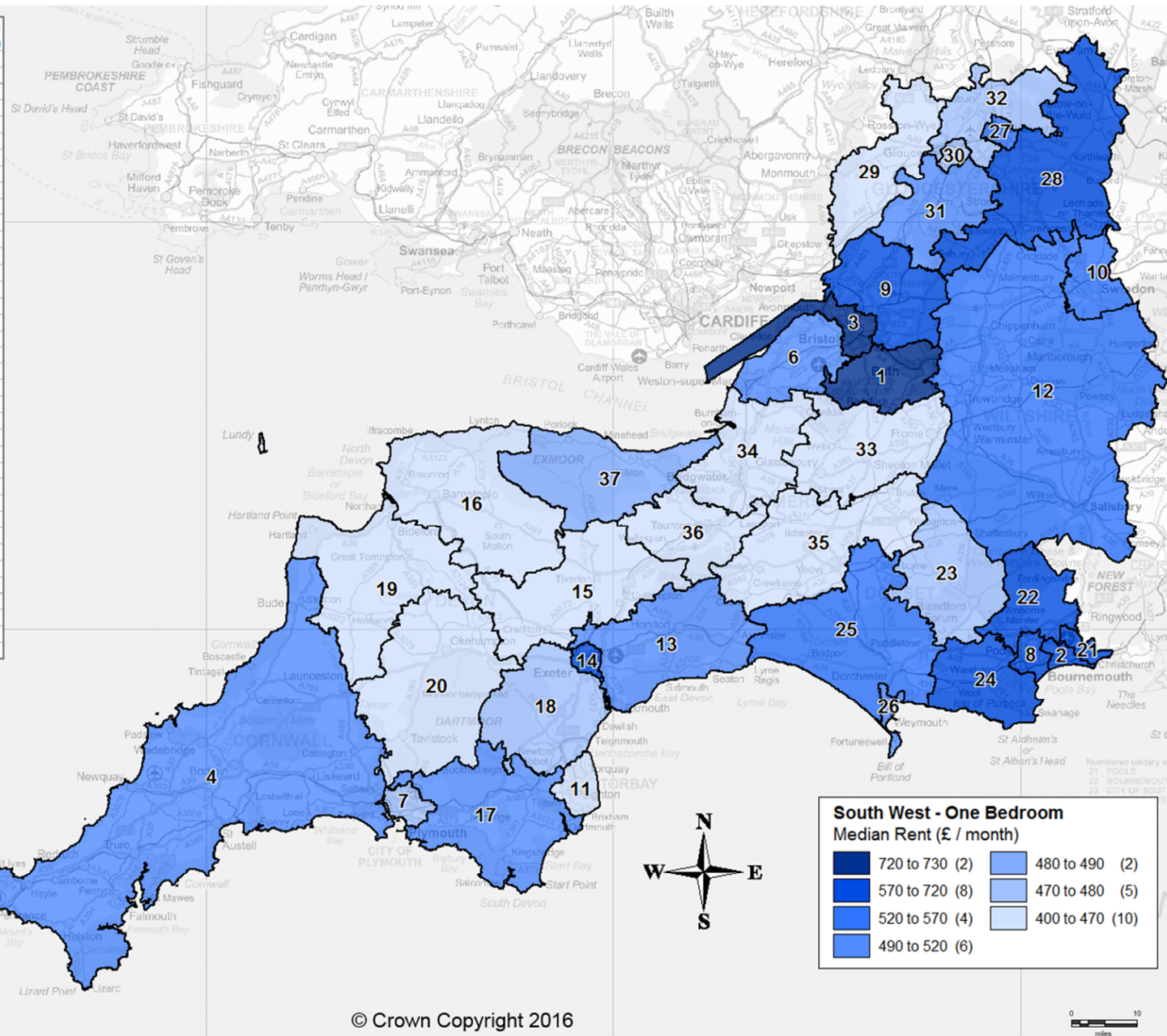

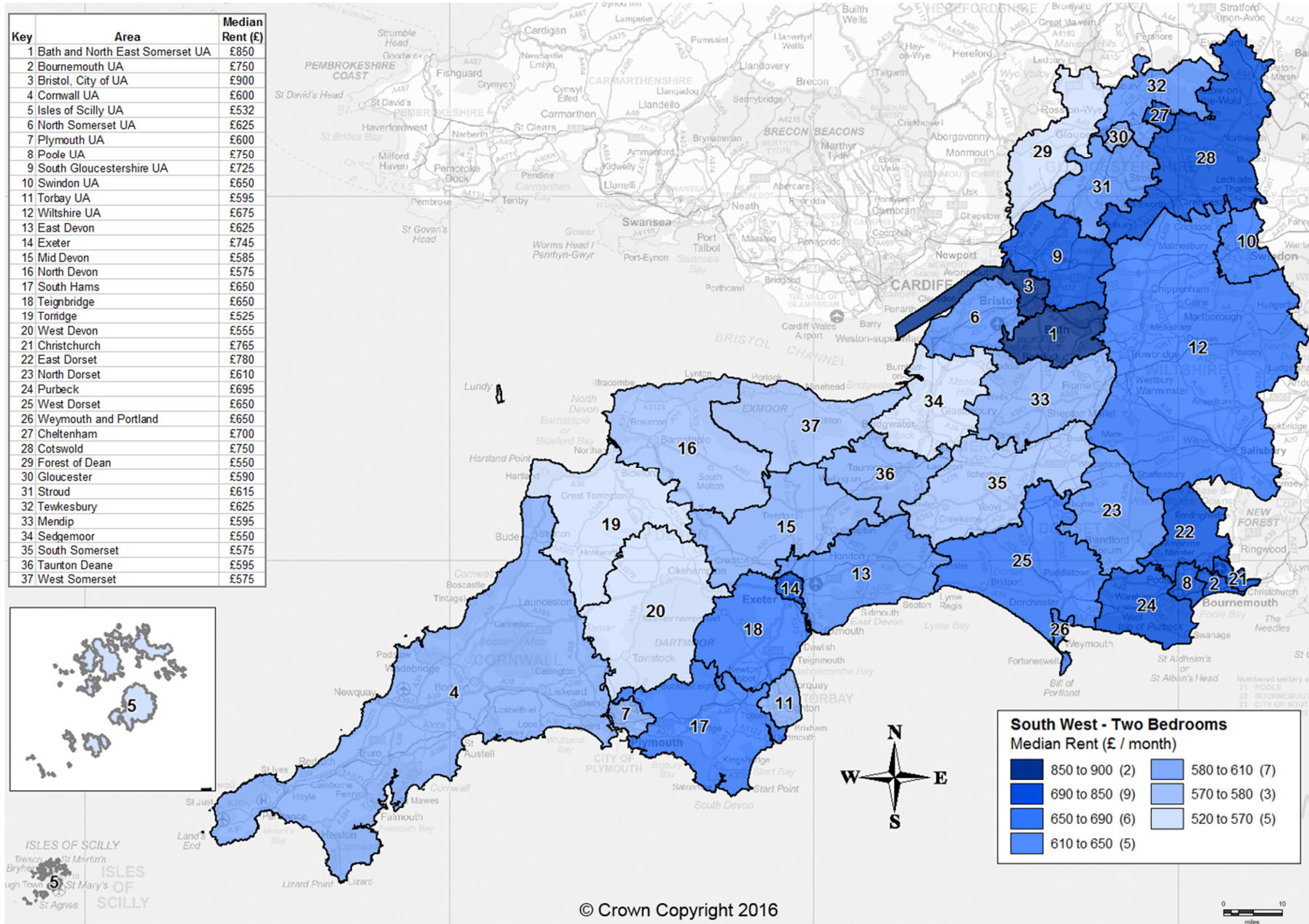

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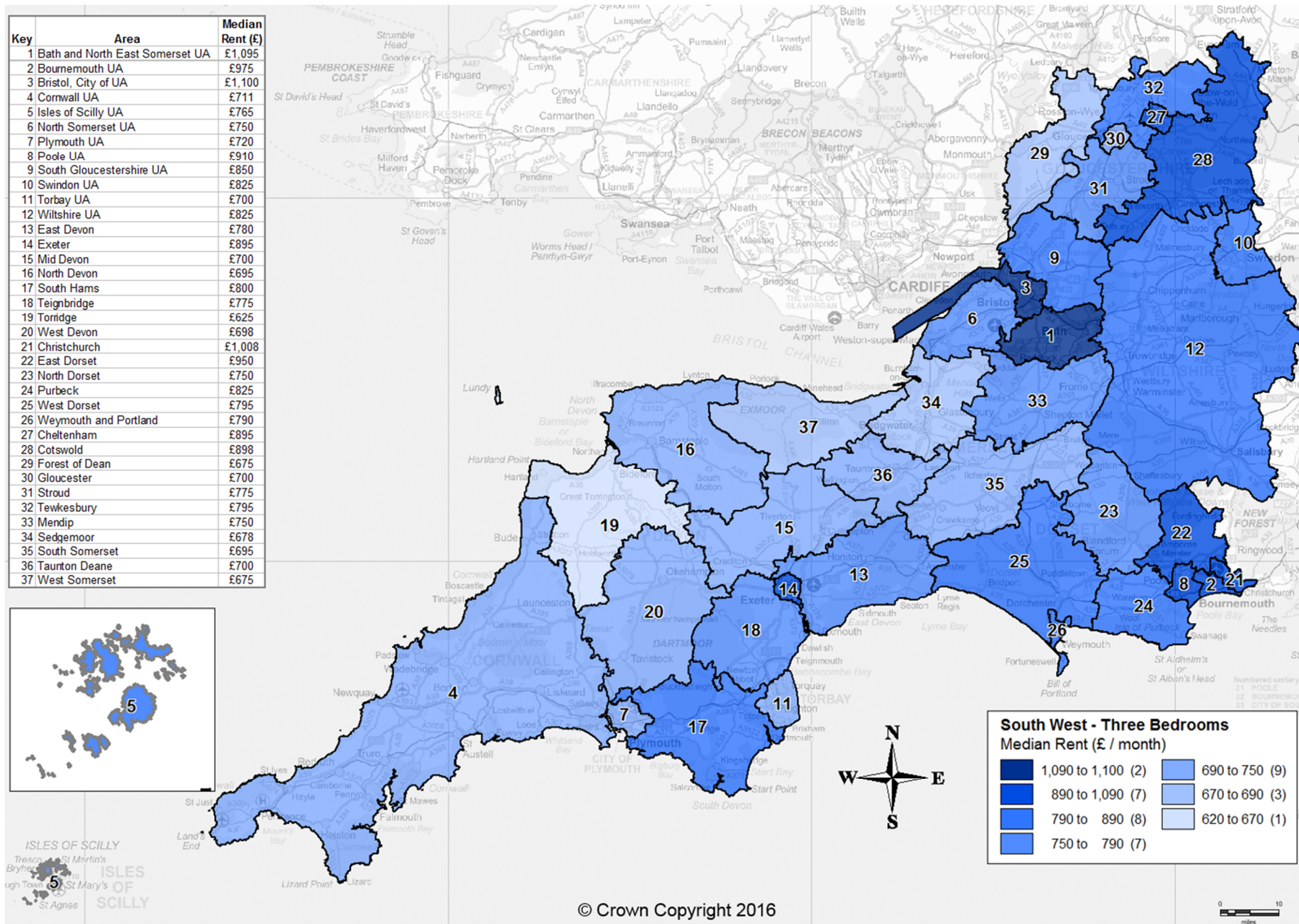
Private Rental Market Statistics, 'Two Bedrooms' monthly rents recorded between 1 April 2015 and 31 March 2016 for South West

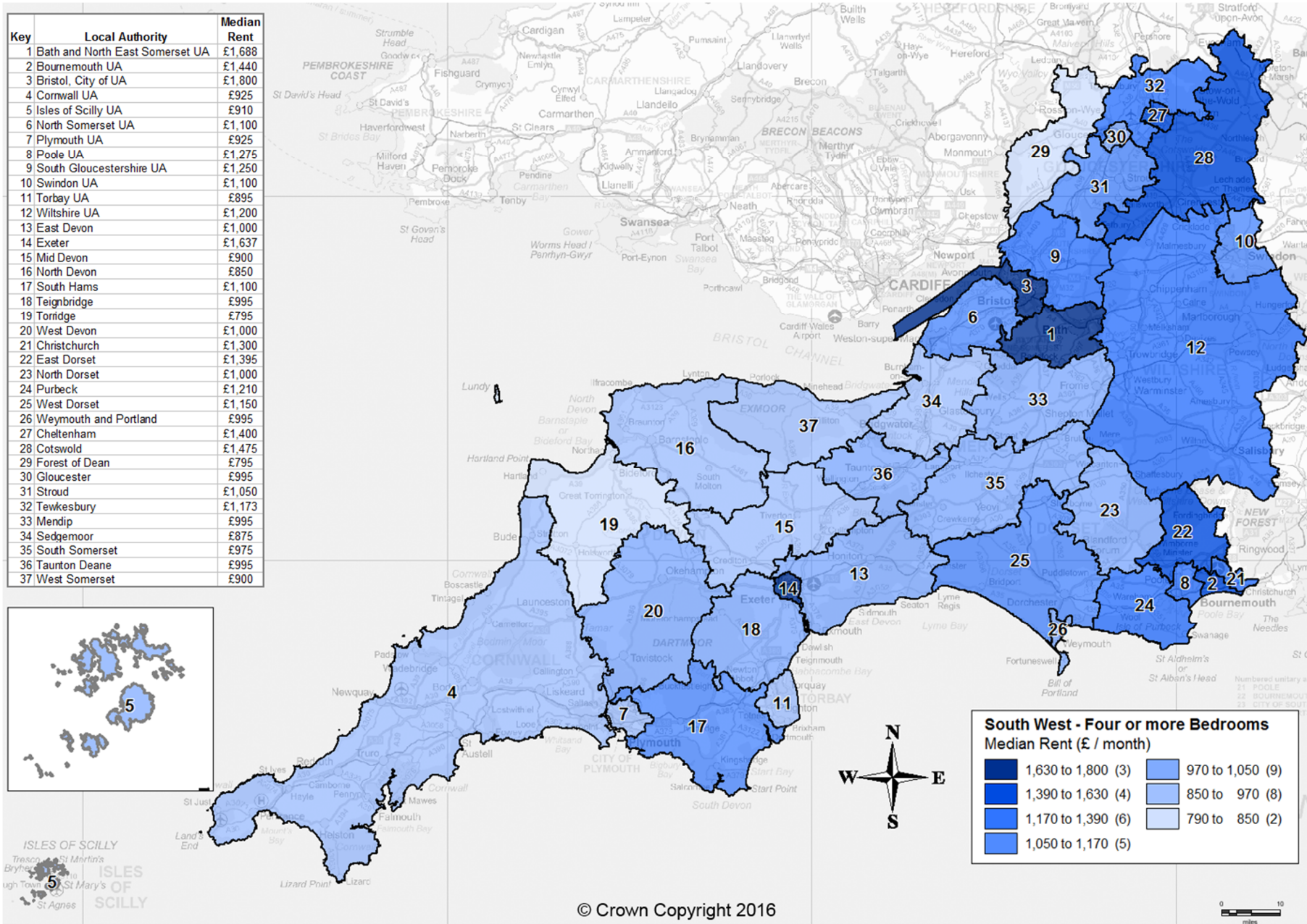
Private Rental Market Statistics, 'Three Bedrooms' monthly rents recorded between 1 April 2015 and 31 March 2016 for South West
