

emailed the Ministry of Deface (MOD) on 4 February seeking information on post service business appointments. The correspondence was treated as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). Lapologise for the delay in replying.

requested the following information:

"In response to a written question published on 27 January 2016, Mark Lancaster stated: 'The Ministry of Defence (MOD) holds records of former employees of the MOD who have applied to serve in foreign militaries under the Business Appointments process.'

- 1. Please state the total number of former employees of the MOD who have applied to serve in foreign militaries under the Business Appointments process in each of the following calendar years: a) 2010, b) 2011, c) 2012, d) 2013, e) 2014, f) 2015 and g) 2016 so far.
- 2. Please break down each yearly total by the foreign militaries applicants proposed to serve in."

A search for the information has now been completed within the MOD, and I can confirm that the information in scope of the request is held. The information requested for the Armed Forces and Civil Servants can be found in the Table below.



If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
