



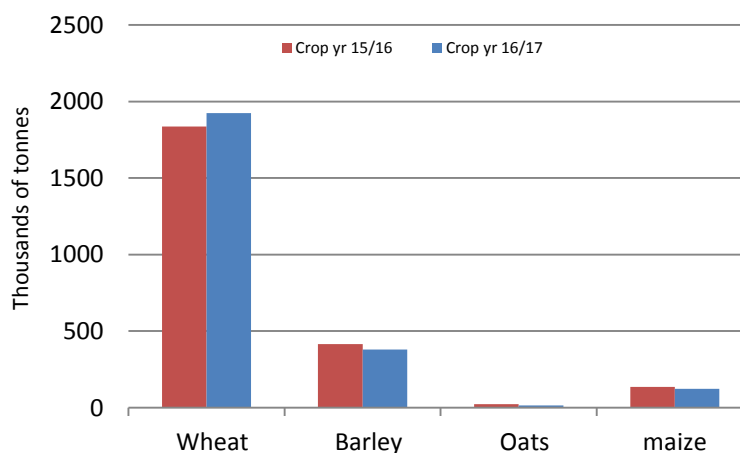

Animal Feed Statistics for Great Britain - November 2016

Key points

- Animal feed production was up 48% for sheep, 4.1% for cattle and calves and 2.9% for poultry and down 2.3% for pigs in November 2016 compared to November 2015.
- 5.9% more wheat was used to produce animal feed in November 2016 than November 2015 and 3.8% less barley.
- Over the crop year from July to November, animal feed production was up 31% for sheep and 2.7% for poultry, down 7.3% for pigs and 2.1% for cattle compared to the previous crop year.
- Over the crop year from July to November, wheat used to produce animal feed was up 4.7% and barley was down 8.7% compared to the previous crop year.

Usage of the Statistics

The UK government and the European Commission use these statistics to monitor and assess stocks of cereals as a key component of our food security. The estimates contribute to the UK cereal balance sheets published by the Agricultural and Horticultural Development Board [AHDB](#). Animal feed processors and grain traders use the estimates to help assess market conditions and inform business decisions.

Revisions

We have reviewed some IPU's (Integrated Poultry Units) which produce both feed for their own use and feed for retail sale. We have adjusted the data from August 2015 which has resulted in an increase in compound poultry feed and a decrease in IPU feed.

Compound animal feed prices – key points

- The quarterly average price of Cattle and Calf compounds between July and September 2016 was £197 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Pig compounds between July and September 2016 was £215 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Poultry compounds between July and September 2016 was £236 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Sheep compounds between July and September 2016 was £208 per tonne
