Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOI Act)

I refer to your email of **8 July 2016** in which you requested information under the FOI Act from Monitor. Since 1 April 2016, Monitor and the NHS Trust Development Authority are operating as an integrated organisation known as NHS Improvement. For the purposes of this decision, NHS Improvement means Monitor.

Your request

You made the following request:

"1) A list of all NHS foundation trusts that provide mental health services and the amount of income that each has received from private patients for the years ending March 2015 and March 2016.

2) A list of ALL NHS foundation trusts that have received an income from private patient activity within the last 12 months.

3) A list of ALL NHS foundation trusts that have exceeded the private patient income cap and the action taken."

Decision

NHS Improvement holds the information that you have requested and has decided to release it.

Question 2

The web link noted above contains the information that we hold on NHS foundation trusts that have received an income from private patient activity within the last 12 months.

Question 3

Please note that the statutory limitation on private patient income in section 44 of the NHS Act 2006 was repealed with effect from 1 October 2012 by the Health and Social Care Act 2012. Before this time, no NHS foundation trusts exceeded the cap.

Section 43 of the NHS Act 2006 (as amended) now states that an NHS foundation trust does not fulfil its principal purpose unless, in each financial year, its total income from goods or services for the purposes of the health service (i.e. the NHS and public health) is more than income from the provision of goods or services for other purposes (including provision of health care to private patients).

Review rights

If you consider that your request for information has not been properly handled or if you are otherwise dissatisfied with the outcome of your request, you can try to resolve this informally with the person who dealt with your request. If you remain dissatisfied, you may seek an internal review within NHS Improvement of the issue or the decision. A senior member of NHS Improvement's staff, who has not previously been involved with your request, will undertake that review.

If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of any internal review, you may complain to the Information Commissioner for a decision on whether your request for information has been dealt with in accordance with the FOI Act.
