PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information about a live animal export which we received on 26 September 2016. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

"Subject Live animal export, Transport and shipping, Wednesday October 5th 2016

I require under the FOI act to obtain evidence based answers to my concerns about the welfare of the livestock being transported . I am aware that APHA has specific and legal obligations with respect to such transportation and the welfare of these animals whilst preparing for and in Transit.

I understand that the consignment was transported in the following vehicle:

DA 902 FN

Please note APHA have no record of vehicle DA 902 FN, but have supplied information relating to vehicle DA 802 FN, to which we have a record of.

- 1. At what time was the first animal loaded at the point of departure and how many were loaded in total?
- 2. Was loading at the departure point supervised by qualified AHVLA directly employed staff?
- 3. Were any of those staff veterinary qualified staff?

In relation to question 1 to 3, APHA do not hold this information as a supervised loading was not carried out by APHA Inspectors.

The Animal and Plant Health Agency is an Executive Agency of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs working to safeguard animal and plant health for the benefit of people, the environment and the economy.

4. Was the journey time to first appropriate feed/Water stop listed as being in excess of 8 hours?

Yes.

5. Was the transporter inspected for suitability and safety prior to departure?

APHA do not hold this information as a supervised loading was not carried out by APHA Inspectors.

6. Did the transporter have more than one qualified driver?

No.

7. If the Journey time was in excess of 8 hours was the journey log submitted and approved for the journey? Please supply a copy of this data.

Yes, please see Appendix 1 attached for section 1 of the planned journey.

8. For the pre departure inspection at Dover, please advise how many veterinary qualified inspectors were present.

None.

9. Please supply copies of the inspection report and journey log and, if issued, I require copies of any statutory notices."

Please see Appendix 1 for section 1 of the Journey Log (WIT07).

Please see Appendix 2 for the WIT32 Portal Inspection report.

No statutory notices served during the portal check at Dover.

Information has been redacted on the attached Appendices under Section 38, Section 40(2) and 40(3)(a)(i) of the Freedom of Information Act (2000).

Section 38 refers to the exemption from the duty to provide information if it would, or would be likely to affect anyone's health or safety.

We recognise that there is a general presumption in favour of transparency and openness concerning our work, and providing the general public with the right to request access to information held by public authorities.

We also recognise that there is a public interest in disclosure of this specific information in order to increase this transparency and aid well-informed debates concerning the welfare and transportation of animals, and the individuals associated with them.

However, we feel that there is a stronger public interest in withholding the information as the full addresses, including the county of origin, the destination and/or rest stops, transporter details and individual names would identify further information and would, or would be likely to, endanger the health and safety of staff. This poses a substantial risk to the health and safety of individuals associated with the transportation of animals that would be of significant severity and is likely to occur in some cases. We consider this to be a significant factor in favour of maintaining the exemption.

APHA has balanced the real threat to the health and safety of individuals which disclosure of the requested information would be likely to cause, against the public interest arguments in favour of disclosure. In this instance the APHA does not consider that disclosing the information requested in order to inform public debate and to promote accountability and transparency would justify the risk to individuals' health and safety.

Section 40(2) and 40(3)(a)(i) refers to other people's personal information. Some of the information contained within the requested documents has been withheld under section 40(2) and 40(3)(a)(i) (third party personal data) of the FOIA as the information constitutes personal data relating to a third party. Section 40(2) and 40(3)(a)(i) of the FOIA provides that personal data relating to third parties is exempt information if disclosure would breach the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA).

APHA consider that disclosure of this information is likely to breach the first data protection principle in Schedule 1 of the DPA, which relates to the fair and lawful processing of personal data, in two ways. First, disclosure would not constitute 'fair' processing of the personal data, second, disclosure would not satisfy any of the conditions for data processing set out in Schedule 2 to the DPA. Therefore, we have concluded that this information is exempt from disclosure under section 40(2) of the FOIA.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOIA and the government's Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context. No information identifying you will be placed on the GOV.UK website.
