Thank you for your email of 22 December 2016 requesting the following information:

"In respect to FOI request 2016/11837, I understand you cannot answer part 1 under section 12. However, please can you provide answers to sections 2, 3 and 4 of my request, which is information which you have confirmed you hold. As this relates to the original request, I would expect this to be answered within the timeline established when I first submitted my request.

Previous Request:

- 2. The target time that the DIO sets itself for issuing these notifictions
- 3. For each handling agent (eg. Mears, Carillion Amey etc.), how many disputes have been:
- a) paid in full as not disputed
- b) paid in full even though sevice personnel have disputed
- c) partially paid eg. dispute partially upheld
- d) no payment made eg. dispute agreed
- In the Army Satisfaction Survey, what feedback was received from service personnel about how their accommodation was managed.
- 4. In the Army Satisfaction Survey, what feedback was received from service personnel about how their accommodation as managed."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD) and I can confirm that the information in scope of your request is held.

Please see below response to number 2:

The target time that the DIO sets itself for issuing notifications of recovery from pay is 5 working days from the receipt of the charge form. This target can be affected by volume received, missing or incorrect information supplied and reduced manpower levels.

Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
