Statistical News Release: Police use of firearms statistics, England and Wales, April 2014 – March 2015

The Home Office published today the latest official statistics on police use of firearms in England and Wales.

The release contains statistics on the total number of police firearms operations, including operations involving Armed Response Vehicles (ARVs); incidents in which police firearms were discharged; and authorised firearms officers in the year ending March 2015.

The statistics show that in the 43 Home Office funded police forces in England and Wales:

- There were 14,666 police firearms operations in the year ending March 2015, a decrease of 2% (-273) when compared with the previous year.
- Operations involving armed Response Vehicles (ARVs) accounted for 84% of all operations in the year ending March 2015; a two percentage point increase when compared with the previous year.
- There were six incidents in which the police discharged firearms in the year ending March 2015; up from two incidents in the previous year.
- There were 5,647 authorised firearms officers (AFOs) on 31 March 2015; a decrease of 4% (-217) when compared with the previous year.
