Request for Information

Thank you for your email of 13 August 2015. You asked:

Details of vehicles entering service since 1 January 2011 which have subsequently been struck off. I am seeking chassis number, Asset Code, Description, Contract, Date into Service and Date struck off for each.

I would like the request to cover all Ministry of Defence vehicles and related equipment.

And subsequently refined this to:

Please can you advise if I time restricted my request to, say, 2014 and 2015 this would bring the request inside the limit?

Alternatively I could reduce the scope to just 'B' vehicles if that would help.

I am treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000. A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

I have provided a table, attached, containing the details of the vehicles that have entered service and have been struck-off from 1 January 2014 to 20 August 2015. You will note that there are five vehicles that are being used as a static training aid.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
