Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the “FOI Act”)

I refer to your email of 2 December 2015 in which you requested information under the FOI Act.

Your request

You made the following request:

Who is the senior officer (outside of procurement) responsible for ICT/Digital/Business Change Programmes & Strategy?

Decision

Monitor holds the information that you have requested and has decided to release it.

Peter Sinden, Chief Information Officer, is responsible for ICT/ICT enabled change programmes/ ICT strategy and has technical oversight for digital delivery.

Business change is however the collective responsibility of Monitor’s Executive Committee (the committee consisting of the Chief Executive and his direct reports). Business strategy is the responsibility of the Chief Executive, supported by the Policy team.

Digital Content and strategy is the responsibility of Monitor’s Strategic Communications Directorate.

Review rights

If you consider that your request for information has not been properly handled or if you are otherwise dissatisfied with the outcome of your request, you can try to resolve this informally with the person who dealt with your request. If you remain dissatisfied, you may seek an

internal review within Monitor of the issue or the decision. A senior member of Monitor's staff, who has not previously been involved with your request, will undertake that review.

If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of any internal review conducted by Monitor, you may complain to the Information Commissioner for a decision on whether your request for information has been dealt with in accordance with the FOI Act.

A request for an internal review should be submitted in writing to FOI Request Reviews, Monitor, Wellington House, 133-155 Waterloo Road, London SE1 8UG or by email to foi@monitor.gov.uk.
