Anti-Corruption Summit - London 2016

Indonesia Country Statement

1. Expose corruption

[Beneficial ownership]

- We commit to improving the transparency of the beneficial ownership of legal persons and legal arrangements to prevent misuse of these entities and arrangements for corruption, tax evasion, terrorist financing and money laundering.
- We commit to exploring the establishment of public central registers of company beneficial ownership information.

[Preventing the Facilitation of Corruption]

 We commit to deploying public-private information sharing partnerships to bring together governments, law enforcement, regulators and the financial sector to detect, prevent and disrupt money laundering linked to corruption.

[Public Procurement and Fiscal Transparency]

- We will work toward the full implementation of the principles of the G20 Principles for Promoting Integrity in Public Procurement and the relevant provisions in United Nations Convention Against Corruption.
- We will work toward the full implementation of the G20 Anti-Corruption Open Data Principles.

[Tax]

- We commit to implement the Common Reporting Standard initiative.
- We commit to implement the Addis Tax Initiative.

[Whistle Blower]

 We commit to strengthen whistle blower system and protect those who have provided information on corruption

2. Punish the corrupt and support those who have suffered from corruption

[Preventing Corrupt Bidders Winning Contracts]

 We commit to strengthen central databases of public contracting companies with final convictions.

[Asset Recovery and Return]

- We commit to participate in the second review cycle of the implementation of Chapter V on Asset Recovery of the United Nations Convention Against Corruption.
- We will afford one another the widest measures of cooperation and assistance in asset recovery
- We commit to strengthen the Stolen Asset Recovery Initiative (StAR) in support of countries' efforts to recover and return stolen assets

[Payments to affected states]

 We will develop common principles governing the payment of compensation to the countries affected, to ensure that such payments are made safely, fairly and in a transparent manner, <u>under the framework of UNCAC</u>.

[Impunity]

• We commit to implement denial of entry mechanism to send stong signal to corrupt individuals that corruption and impunity are unacceptable.

3. Drive out the culture of corruption, wherever it exists

[Innovation]

• We commit to participating in an Innovation Hub that will facilitate the uptake of new approaches and technologies to tackle corruption.

[International System]

- We will work with other countries, civil society, international organisations to support accelerated implementation of the voluntary provisions of the United Nations Convention Against Corruption.
- We commit to combating corruption and bribery at regional level by strengthening the South East Asia Parties Against Corruption.

[Anti-Corruption Education]

 We commit to instill anti-corruption culture through anti-corruption education and campaign.
