Thank you for your email of 21 December 2015 requesting the following information:

"Thank-you for your response, which I believe you have answered adequately in most respects. However, I request that you reconsider your answers to questions 2 and 4 as I do not believe they have been answered fully.

Question 2: I request details of who is responsible for the maintenance of the non Families Quarters assets on the estate (to include the communal areas, community centre, and services to include roads, perimeter fencing, lighting, drainage). This should include contact numbers to report issues.

Answer 2: Maintenance of the Community Centre is carried out by CarillionAmey - they can be contacted on 0800 707 6000.

Omission: This answer only refers to the Community Centre, whereas my question also requested details regarding the responsibility for the communal areas and services to the whole estate, to include roads, perimeter fencing, lighting and drainage.

Question 4: I would like to know if any byelaws are extant or expired for the area and if not, are there plans to introduce any (if so, I request a timescale).

Answer 4: There are no byelaws extant or expired at Medmenham.

Omission 4: The answer does not cover the part of the question which refers to any plans to introduce any byelaws (to include a timescale if appropriate)."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence and I can confirm that all the information in scope of your request is held.

The information you have requested can be found below:

2. The Medmenham Estate, including all communal areas and community centres, also services to roads, fencing, lighting and drainage are managed by CarillionAmey.
4. There are currently no byelaws planned at Medmenham.
