I understand that you have appointed solicitor to the panel and I would be grateful if you can provide me with details of the same so I may correspond with him or her in order that I may give appropriate advice to the Governor and to SHG as to disclosure and you are able to conduct the business of the inquiry.

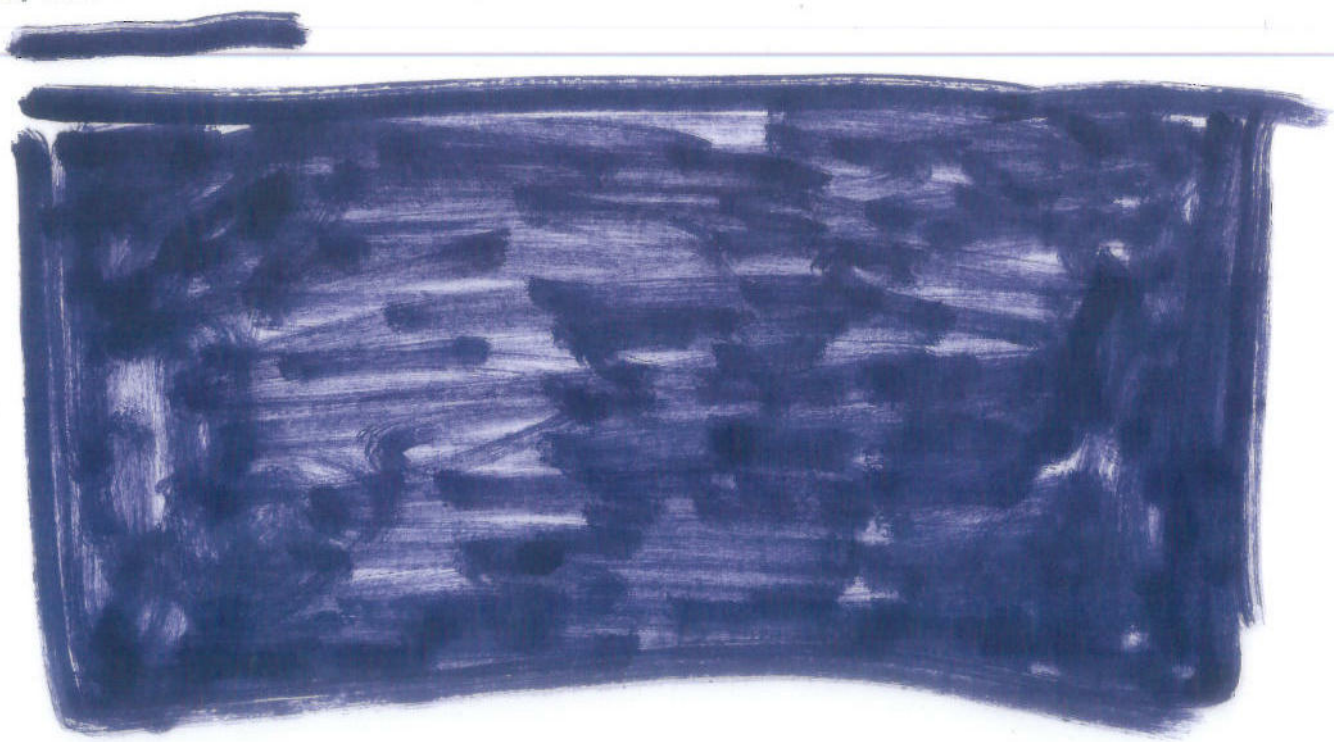

Good to hear from you.

I am very frustrated by the glacial process I have encountered in getting all the necessary arrangements in place to make your announcement. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] All papers are now with the Foreign Secretary (again – since the last one) and I might get consent to make an announcement on 18 November (next Tue). This was passed on to me this morning. It is not confirmed yet and we might not hear until Friday for sure.

Travel arrangements are absolutely in place. Cabins are reserved and flights are reserved in principle but we need names as soon as we can. Obviously, you can't appoint people until you have the announcement and know that everything is sound and ready to proceed.

We have appointed a new child safeguarding and domestic violence policy officer – [REDACTED]. She is copied in. [REDACTED] will become your point person for this inquiry and will be the person to travel to St Helena with you in March. It would be good if [REDACTED] could come and meet you at some point.

I feel terrible that we have been so slow – it has been very difficult to make sure funding is in the right place and that all the right Ministers from different departments are happy. I believe we are now days away from full sign off.

I hope this email finds you and the panel members well.

I wanted to take the opportunity to apprise you of some brief but positive feedback the UK delegation received from the UN Human Rights Committee (UNHRC) during its examination of the UK's seventh periodic report to the UNHRC under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR), which may be of interest to you. The report itself was submitted to the UN back in 2012 (attached).

A member of my Unit, [redacted] personally attended examination in Geneva as part of the UK delegation in her capacity as the Human Rights and Social Policy Desk Officer in order to address any questions that might arise regarding the Overseas Territories' compliance with the Covenant. We were aware of the UN's interest in developments in St Helena due to the advanced list of issues it presented to the UK in November (attached). The UK's response, including action taken in St Helena, can be found in paragraph 159 of the supplementary report attached.

During the examination, [redacted] said that he 'applauded' the UK and St Helena on their efforts to address child abuse with their respective jurisdictions. We are not due to receive the Committee's concluding observations for a short while yet, and I will ensure, once received, that these are shared with you if any further reference is made about this or indeed any other issue of potential relevance. Nevertheless, we are pleased to have received this positive feedback.

- > The only thing that remains before an announcement can be made is the question of administrative assistance and the other requirements necessary to run such an inquiry.

- > I understand that the FCO is being renovated and I am more than happy to undertake all of the preliminary reading at my chambers. However, I do not have the resources in my chambers to host meetings, supply secretarial staff nor provide administrative support. Panel selection, interviewing and meetings, for example, will clearly require office space as well as some support staff. I have assumed that you intend to provide the inquiry with the necessary funds, accommodation, administrative support, make travel arrangements and provide the skills required to run the operation both here and on St Helena. We have not discussed these essential aspects and it may have been remiss of me to have taken your full support for granted and not to have asked you for clarification.

- > I had expected, and will require, to be able to call upon you to supply necessary back-up facilities and staff with both the experience and skills necessary to run and manage the inquiry as well as to provide and administer the funding required. I had envisaged that you would offer me the services of an experienced administrator to act as secretary to the inquiry who can manage and run the small organisation and work with the panel when it meets. This is not a full time job but it will require a person able to support the inquiry as and when required both here and on St Helena where I anticipate the we will wish to arrange to interview a number of witnesses. It will also be necessary to have a single point of contact able to deal with confidential personal contacts, statements and so forth. I had not anticipated, nor do I have the expertise to organise and manage this side of things. Besides that, it would not be economic for me to be employed in these tasks.

- > I feel sure that you will have all this under control and in hand but you have not yet explained the mechanics to me. Given that you appear to have accommodation problems of your own, clarification and pre-agreement on these matters is essential before we move forward. I do not see a problem but we can also address any conflicts you may be concerned about if the inquiry is reliant, as it inevitably will be, on full FCO support.

Thank you for you e-mail.

Timings do appear to be a real problem. My dates, are unalterable as they are fixed by the pre-existing court commitments which I outlined in my previous discussions and e-mail to you.

After having read the material, my plan was to undertake a preliminary visit in order to begin the inquiry by meeting the relevant personnel and visiting the various authorities involved in all aspects child care on the island. This first visit would provide me with an insight into how best to structure the panel and decide whether or not to recruit investigators to look into specific areas before the panel arrived on the island in order to make the most of their subsequent visit.

Your first suggestion, of a flying visit will require almost two weeks travel and huge public expense for little progress. I understand that this may serve a public relations purpose but for me this is not a viable option. I have not yet read the material but it is clear that I would benefit from an initial meeting with the Governor, some members of his staff, the community representatives, the various judicial authorities, certain individuals in the police, social welfare and education departments and perhaps representatives of the health authorities as well as to see the facilities and systems in operation on the island. A fruitful visit



cannot be achieved in a few hours and it may well also create a poor impression of a distant, disconnected authority whereas a successful inquiry requires co-operation and constructive assistance from the islanders.

The second choice you suggest conflicts with the pre-commitments I have advised you of, I cannot leave a trial half way through. Your third date clashes with my second case and would require that I return two weeks after the start of an [REDACTED] which I have been working on for eighteen months. That is also clearly out of the question.

I appreciate the sensitivity of this inquiry politically, socially and economically to both the government and the islanders and the need to begin the process as soon as practicable. Regrettably, this appears to mean that either you will have to replace me with someone who has a free diary or accept that my first visit to the island cannot take place until March. By March we would have empanelled a small group and perhaps been able to send a pathfinder team to look into any specific aspects arising from the written material. However, such an unprepared visit may well open up further areas of investigation requiring a second visit by the panel with all its associated costs, travel co-ordination and potential diary clashes of a larger group of people. I had hoped I might avoid this by undertaking a preparatory solo visit.

Please let me have your thoughts.

I have listed the options for the QC to visit below, as previously advised this is the busiest time of the year for travel to St Helena. I apologise for not being to get back to you sooner, I have had to go through all of the berthing sheets to see who could be moved – this is a time consuming exercise.

The FCO will have more chance of getting seats on the RAF flight – we are already experiencing huge problems with the allocation.

Getting to and from St Helena is far from straightforward. I also suggest that for any follow up visit you book well in advance if possible.

Hope this is of help to you.

**Option 1** Please note this will only give 1.5 day's work time on island – the RMS is scheduled to arrive around 10am, taking into account disembarkation, collecting of luggage etc, the afternoon of 8 Dec will be available for work. The ETD on 10 Dec is 10:00, this will mean an early start with baggage at the wharf for 08:00 and embarkation shortly thereafter.
