Thank you for your email of 19 February 2016 where you requested the following information;

I am making a Freedom of Information request for the complete Job Evaluation Whole Trade Scores for separate trades within RAF Trade Group 5, General Engineering including General Engineering Technician, General Technician (Electrical), General Technician (Mechanical) and General Technician Workshops, not the overall score for which the New Employment Model is based.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

We have now completed a search for the information you requested and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held. The information you requested is included in the table below.

In determining Trade Group 5's Whole Trade Score, the Joint Service Job Evaluation Team included the trade scores for Flight Sergeants (FS) and Warrant Officers (WO) in the General Engineering Technician trade, this is because FS and WO General Engineering Technicians can be selected from any of the above trades.

If you are not satisfied with this response or wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. Please note that any request for an internal review must be made

within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
