Thank you for your email of 2 November 2015 where you requested the following information:

"Whether any assessment was carried out on the impact of the decision to end new public subsidies for onshore wind farms on jobs and investment in Scotland."

"If such an assessment exists can a copy be supplied".

We have considered your request in accordance with the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 ('the EIRs') as the information you have sought disclosure of, does in our view, fall within the definition of 'environmental information' as stated in the EIRs.

The Government's policy is to close the Renewables Obligation (RO) one year early, on 31 March 2016, to new onshore wind across Great Britain (GB). We published an impact assessment (IA) on 8 September which considers the impact of this policy on jobs and investment across GB. Therefore, information on the impact on jobs and investment in Scotland is not shown separately.

The IA was updated on 8 October following a review of evidence received during DECC's stakeholder engagement exercise and changes to the final policy position as a result. This information is publically available and can be found online at:
