FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 REQUEST REF: 0423-15

Thank you for your email of 30 April asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

Could you please tell me the number of people who have had an exit interview on leaving the department in every one of the five financial years since 2010/11?

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested. The Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold some information relevant to your request, but that it is not readily available in the form that you required.

The following number of FCO UK based officers exited from the Foreign & Commonwealth in each of the past five years since April 2010.

Data is not held centrally for locally engaged staff working overseas.

Given that FCO staff can be serving in the UK or overseas our practice is to ask those leaving the organisation to complete and return an "FCO leaver interview" form setting out their reasons for leaving. Completed forms are returned to HR Directorate which periodically analyses the information to help inform future policies.

Following Cabinet Office guidance issued in November 2014, we now conduct exit interviews for permanent members of Senior Civil Service staff who resign from the organisation.

Once an FOI request is answered, it is considered to be in the public domain. To promote transparency, we may now publish the response and any material released on <u>gov.uk</u> in the <u>FOI releases</u> section. All personal information in the letter will be removed before publishing.

The copies of information being supplied to you continue to be protected by the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988. You are free to use it for your own purposes, including any non-commercial research you are doing and for the purposes of news reporting. Any other re-use, for example commercial publication, would require the permission of the copyright holder.
