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Additional funding to meet the costs of implementing welfare reform changes in 2014/15

Introduction

- 1. This circular is to inform you of additional funding of £18.4 million that will be allocated to local authorities (LAs) to support the administrative costs of implementing welfare reform changes in 2014/15.
- 2. The funding is intended to meet 'new burdens' incurred by LAs as a result of the ongoing implementation of the following areas of welfare reform:
 - changes to Local Housing Allowance (LHA) (including the move to an annual up-rating cycle and changes to the shared accommodation rate)
 - the Removal of the Spare Room Subsidy (RSRS) (including the unintended exemption for certain pre-1996 cases)
 - the benefit cap

Details

3. Although you will receive a single payment, to provide transparency a breakdown of the total funding is given below

Area of activity	Funding distribution based on	Funding (to nearest £0.1million)
LHA Changes	 A combined approach of: distribution of estimated claimant losses from changes as set out in Subsidy circular <u>S4/2013</u>, and latest estimates of the LHA caseload in each LA 50% of overall funds are allocated on each basis 	£2.2 million
RSRS – general	Distribution based on the latest published numbers subject to a RSRS reduction in each LA	£8.4 million
RSRS – reassessment of pre-1996 cases	Distribution based on the latest published numbers subject to a RSRS reduction in each LA	£2.1 million

- 4. This funding is intended to meet the identified costs arising from the implementation of the above measures in 2014/15. In the case of RSRS, for example, it is intended primarily to meet the costs of administering additional applications for Discretionary Housing Payments (DHP). It also provides funding for ongoing communications with claimants to help them consider their options. It is, of course, for local decision what aspects of the additional administrative cost you actually spend it on.
- 5. Each element of the funding has been distributed amongst LAs on a basis that reflects the likely distribution of costs, as indicated in the table above. The aggregate allocations are included in Annex A.
- 6. Each LA will receive a single payment in the week commencing 21 April 2014.
- 7. Funding for 2015/16 and beyond will be subject to discussions with the LA Associations. We will continue to assess the ongoing impact of welfare reforms on LA administration in line with the new burdens doctrine.

Other funding

8. Funding will also be distributed to meet the IT costs of enhancements to Single Housing Benefit Extract reporting and to assist with the new burdens arising from the removal of access to HB for European Economic Area jobseekers from 1 April 2014. Details of this additional funding will be provided in due course.
