## NOMS IFTS accreditation



To demonstrate its commitment to best practice in managing licensing activities, NOMS has obtained accreditation from the Information Fair Trader Scheme (IFTS) managed by The National Archives.

The IFTS requires accredited public sector bodies to encourage re-use of their information and to reach certain standards of fairness and transparency. It reassures users that an accredited organisation's processes are consistent with government policy on information trading, and that they meet the needs of existing and potential customers.
