2015 to 2016 academic year final report

Main Headlines

Applications received/ approved	The number of applications received for 24+ Advanced Learning Loans increased from 67,280 in the 2014/15 academic year to 80,650 in 2015/16. The number of applications approved (ready for payment) increased from 56,870 in 2014/15 to 71,190 in 2015/16.
Total loan amount approved and average loan amount	The total value for loans approved increased from £148.8m in the 2014/15 academic year to £195.2m in 2015/16. The average loan ready for payment also increased from £2,620 in 2014/15, to £2,740 in 2015/16.
Provision type	Level 3 Diplomas received the most applications in the 2015/16 academic year, with 49,640 applications received and 44,060 approved. Overall, a total of £129.4m was approved for level 3 Diplomas, with an average loan of £2,940.
Applicant demographics	The highest number of applications received were from the 24-30 year old age group, with 31,060 being received and 27,140 approved for the 2015/16 academic year. 70 per cent of applications received were by females (56,840) and 81 per cent of applications were received by UK nationals (65,340).
Top 10 qualifications	The Diploma in Fitness Instructing and Personal Training (QCF) qualification awarded by the Lifetime Awarding Organisation (LAO) received the most 24+ Advanced Learning Loan applications in the 2015/16 academic year. This qualification received 3,310 applications, with 3,080 applications approved.
Sector Subject Area	The Health, Public Services and Care sector subject area (SSA) received the most applications, at 24,810 . Of these, 21,640 were approved. The largest average amount for approved applications was in the Engineering and Manufacturing Technologies SSA (4,370) .
Learning provider type	General Further Education and Colleges (including Tertiary Colleges) received 43,830 applications for the 2015/16 academic year, of which 38,290 were approved. There were also 31,190 applications received for Private Sector Public Funded learning providers, of which 27,850 were approved.


- 1. This is a Department for Education report for the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans system and contains information relating to courses starting in the 2015/16 academic year. This final report uses data from the Student Loans Company's (SLC) live database. Data used includes applications received up until 30 September 2016, although applications closed for the 2015/16 academic year on 31 July 2016. This allows any applications that were submitted after the closing date due to certain circumstances to be included, as well as final processing to be completed on applications already submitted.
- 24+ Advanced Learning Loans have been expanded to those aged 19 and over starting in the 2016/17 academic year and have been renamed to 'Advanced Learning Loans'.
- 3. The report contains an outline of the data source as well as tables presenting the number of applications received, the number of applications approved, the amount of loan awarded to those approved, and the average (mean) amount awarded. Given the nature of the SLC live database, the information presented is at 30 September 2016.
- 4. The next release of Advanced Learner Loans Information will be on 24 November 2016, and will relate to applications submitted to the end of October 2016 for the 2016/17 academic year. A final report for the 2016/17 academic year is planned for release in October 2017.

2. Data Source

The data used to produce this report are sourced from the live Student Loans Company (SLC) application database. The data refer to all applications received for 24+ Advanced Learning Loans, which include both unprocessed and processed applications, but exclude those ineligible, cancelled, deleted and in data entry. The live database provides information on applications, and is updated on an ongoing basis due to applications being processed, therefore data presented throughout the academic year are subject to change. A database snapshot provides data on applications (including application state) as it was held for any given date. This report uses application data on the 30 September 2016 for the 2015/16 academic year. Data presented in this report may also change for particular applications at some point in the future, but this is unlikely to affect the numbers significantly.

Figure 1 provides an overview of different application states. The state of an application can depend on various factors, including how much progress has been made processing the application, as well as the accuracy of the information and supporting evidence provided. In the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans report, the definition of applications received exclude those that are in data entry, ineligible, cancelled or deleted.





Applications move between different states on an ongoing basis. For example, an application may be in data entry and move to awaiting approval or an application that has been approved may move into the cancelled, deleted or in data entry state. It is therefore possible that the number of applications received could decrease from one month to the next if a large amount of applications move to the states in the red boxes and are no longer classed as an application received. Also, due to the changing of states, the sum of monthly application states over the course of the academic year will not equal the total for the full academic year.

3. Other Related Statistics

On 6 October 2016, the Department for Education published the <u>Further Education and Skills Statistical First Release</u>, which contains provisional full year figures relating to the number of Learnings participating in FE who are funded through the 24+ Advanced Learning Loans system (see Table 11 and 26 from the most recent release). Figures for 2015/16 include some Learnings whose course started in the 2013/14 and 2014/15 academic years that continued into the 2015/16 academic year, and so these figures are not comparable to those in this report.

The Student Loans Company also published their <u>24+ Advanced Learning Loans Paid in England</u> publication on 6 October 2016, which includes information on payments made to FE providers on behalf of loans-funded Learnings during the 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16 academic years. Data presented relates to Learnings who are participating on a further education course funded by an 24+ Advanced Learning Loan, and hence are not directly comparable to the application figures presented in this report.

On 16 June 2016, the Student Loans Company published <u>Debt and Repayment statistics</u> <u>for England</u>, which included figures debt and repayment relating to some 24+ Advanced Learning Loans for the 2015/16 financial year.


