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# Allocation of Housing Benefit reforms transitional funding in 2013/14

# Introduction

1 This circular sets out the arrangements for distributing £10 million funding for 2013/14 to ease the transition of the Housing Benefit (HB) changes.

### Background

- 2 On 30 November 2010, ministers announced administrative funding of up to £50 million across the parliament to support the transition to the Housing Benefit changes that were announced at the June 2010 Budget.
- 3 In 2011/12 we allocated £4 million through a bidding process, with 10 successful bids from local authorities (LAs). A further £15 million was allocated in 2012/13 to help with the transition to the Local Housing Allowance (LHA) reforms and there will be up to £15 million available in 2014/15.

# Distribution of funding for 2013/14

- £10 million funding for 2013/14 will be allocated to LAs through a formula that reflects the estimated impact of the removal of the spare room subsidy (RSRS). The formula is based on the anticipated losses between the pre-and post-reform levels of HB received by social rented sector claimants in each LA area. The same formula was used to allocate Discretionary Housing Payment (DHP) funds in respect of the RSRS (<u>Circular S1/2013</u>).
- 5 The distribution formula is intended, as far as possible, to target resources in 2013/14 according to need. When making our decision we consulted the Local Authority Associations (LAAs). We have not yet decided how next years' funding will be allocated, but it will reflect customer need and demand as welfare reforms continue to be implemented.
- 7 Appendix A shows each authority's allocation for 2013/14.

#### Intended use of funding

- 8 As previously, it is the Government's intention that these funds are used to provide targeted support to help to meet the housing needs of claimants affected by HB reforms. For example, this could involve preventing homelessness, supporting people who need to move, and giving money advice. They could also be used to provide additional DHPs, over and above the government contribution.
- 9 These funds are not intended to meet new administrative burdens arising from welfare reforms. The Department has separately provided LAs with

£24.1 million to support the costs of implementing welfare reform changes in 2013/14 (<u>Circular S4/2013</u>).

- 9 Examples of potential use of funding include:
  - support for Housing Options or Homelessness teams to deal with customers affected by the reforms
  - obtaining services, such as money advice or help finding work, provided by partner organisations
  - pooling resources for joint initiatives between different LAs
  - lump sum costs associated with housing such as removal costs, rent in advance and deposits.
- 10 To support last year's funding we published findings of good practice from visiting LAs implementing the LHA reforms. Much of this is still relevant. <u>www.dwp.gov.uk/docs/lha-reforms-good-practice.pdf</u>

- 12 We intend to monitor how this funding is used, along with new arrangements for feedback on the use of DHP spending.

#### Payment of transitional funding

13 We will make a one-off payment to each LA. The payment will be made separately from the administration subsidy grant and will be paid during August 2013.
