## Adult Learners' Week National Awards 2015

The prestigious Adult Learners' Week (ALW) national awards ceremony was held on Monday 15 June in London. ALW awards recognise and celebrate the achievements of people whose learning experiences have transformed their own lives and the lives of those around them. Presenter Greg Foot hosted the awards and Angus Gray, Head of ESF Division in DWP, presented the ESF awards. Adult Learners' Week is now in its 24<sup>th</sup> year. Part of ALW is supported

through ESF Technical Assistance, which provides many opportunities for ESF support for skills and inclusion related skills/learning activity (including through the ESF award winners stories) to be promoted throughout the initiative.. Short films about all the national Adult Learners' Week award winners are on the Adult Learners' website. In addition to the national award winners local level ESF awards have also been presented at events around the country.

Andrea Sanders won the national ESF Outstanding Individual award. Learning enabled Andrea to transform her life, manage her mental health condition and embark on a new career as a social care worker. Through Jobcentre Plus, she joined the Future Carers Programme, a preemployment project supported by ESF. This kick-started her journey into social care, through which she completed a range of accredited courses and secured a work placement at a care home in Barnsley, at the end of which, she was offered a permanent job.

**Katie Crisp** won the national ESF Young Adult Learner of the Year. When Katie became a teenage mother, she thought she had come to the end of her education, with no chance of a rewarding career. Thanks to a range of provision including taking an HE taster programme in Community Development which is part of the ESF Raising Aspirations project, she is able to pursue her dream of going to university and becoming a youth worker.

The ESF national Project Award went to the **Wiltshire Scrapstore**. The Wiltshire Scrapstore is a small community-based environmental charity that not only makes the planet greener, but also helps people to use learning to improve their lives. Funding is through an ESF Community Grant which benefits fifteen learners who are furthest removed from the workplace, whether because of an emotional or physical disability, through lack of educational opportunity or special educational needs.
