

The Langley Academy Primary Impact Assessment

Basic Need – forecast Reception Year surpluses / shortfalls

1. The table below shows the forecast shortfall in Reception Year places in Slough. The data has been provided by Slough Council via the department's 2013 School Capacity (SCAP) survey. This shows a projected shortfall of 181 Reception places (7.9%) across 2015/16, 2016/17 and 2017/18. This reflects an increasing shortfall of overall primary places in Slough across the same three year period.

2. Data from the 2014 SCAP survey is currently being quality-assured by DfE analysts and is expected to be ready before the end of January. However, analysts' initial assessment of the data is that Slough's forecast shortfall in primary places is almost 1,600 primary places in 18/19, which would be a shortfall of around 10% so SCAP14 shows there is growing need.

Current school capacity / surpluses

3. The table below details the impact rating on the 7 primary schools which are situated within a 0.8 mile radius (the average distance travelled by children to their primary school in Slough) without factoring in Slough's forecast shortfall of Reception Year

places in the table above. The surplus figures cover all primary year groups.

			point of entry year (2013/14): 13					12 January 2015 (closing date for applications is 15 January), the school has received 31 first choice applications, 28 second choice and 34 third choice applications (93 in total) had been received for the 90 places on offer. Taking the above into account, it is our view that parents may be attracted to an alternative provider. This may make it difficult for the school to improve. This could exacerbate the surplus places issue for Marish and therefore the new free school could affect the long-term viability of the school. Given the free school's aim of providing a high quality education and that Marish has been rated as inadequate by Ofsted, we believe that the additional competition is justified to help drive up standards in the area.

Parlaunt Park Primary Academy converted to academy status in 2012 and was taken over by the Langley Academy Trust which is proposing the free school. The trust which also runs the secondary Langley Academy and PPPA and the free school will both act as a feeder schools to the secondary academy. The school was rated as good by Ofsted in November 2011 before its conversion. The school has 90 surplus places although only 2 of these are at reception. TLAP is therefore unlikely to affect the long term financial viability of the school.

The school became subject to special measures following an inspection in June 2013. Ofsted reported in September 2013 that a change of leadership following the special measures judgement had sharply focussed on actions to address the areas for improvement. The school converted to academy status in January 2014 (as part of a multi-academy trust with Upton Court Grammar School) and new governance has been put in place. The school has 91 surplus places of which 4 are at reception. The Free School is 0.8 miles away from the site of the free school, the furthest distance a pupil would on average travel to a primary school and there are six other primary schools between this and the free school so TLAP is unlikely to affect the long term financial viability of the school.
