Skills Funding Agency Financial Assurance 2014 to 2015

I am writing to you in my role as Chair of the Skills Funding Agency's (SFA's) Data and Management Information Advisory Group (DMIAG). This is a sector-led group that is committed to ensuring that the SFA's data requirements remain open and transparent.

As part of the SFA's assurance and audit work, they continue to monitor that colleges and training organisations (providers) are using funding in line with government priorities as set out in the funding rules.

The SFA has been working with providers throughout the year to resolve specific data issues and this has already led to a significant reduction in the number of errors recorded. This has included:

- publishing several articles in Update, drawing providers' attention to particular issues
- producing Technical Guidance notes to advise on how you should record data in the Individualised Learner Record (ILR) returns to reflect the evidence you hold
- continuing to provide Rule Violations reports that you receive each time you make a data submission through the Hub
- contacting those providers who have the most issues

It is important as a sector that we now make sure our data is accurate before the end of the funding year 2014 to 2015. To support this process, and following advice from DMIAG, the SFA has produced a summary report that provides an overview of areas that they are monitoring. This is attached and indicates, at a glance, how many errors and potential errors you have for each aspect. Please note, even where you have no errors, a report has been generated.

We have advised the SFA to use R10 data for this purpose as this was the last full return for all providers. However, we know that you may have corrected your data since then and in such cases, the attached report should be used for sense-checking your current data using the toolkits at your disposal.

This report is provided in addition to the list of records identified as an error or potential error in your Provider-Data Self-Assessment Toolkit (PDSAT) that you should use to check your data. Even where errors are described as 'potential errors' it is important that you review the accuracy of these as the number of records in these categories is currently a higher figure than would be expected.

As you would expect, it is important for the SFA to have confidence in the funding claim and this action is being taken to ensure we work effectively together to reduce the volume of data errors at the end of the year.

If you have data errors at the end of the funding year following the R14 ILR return, the SFA are likely to consider:

- recovering funding after R14 where there is confidence that the claim has been made in error, (those issues
 described as 'error' in the attached summary)
- reserving the right to conduct issue-specific assurance visits before the end-of-year reconciliation statements are issued, even if that results in a delay in issuing individual reconciliation statements in some cases
- ensuring these issues inform the SFA's risk-based selection of providers for audit in the 2015 to 2016 funding year
