Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the "FOI Act")

I refer to your email of **5 February 2016** in which you requested information under the FOI Act.

Your request

You made the following request:

- *'Did the Monitor pay for a NLA (Newspaper Licensing Agency) or CLA (Copyright Licensing Agency) media license in 2013-2014?*
- *If so, how much did the Monitor pay for the licenses in 2013-2014 (please provide the figures separately)?*
- *Did the Monitor pay for other media licenses in 2013-2014? Please list any other media licenses the council subscribed to and how much was paid for them in 2013-2014.'*

Decision

Monitor has interpreted your request to relate to our financial year, which is 1 April to 31 March. Monitor holds the information and has decided to release this. During the 2013/14 financial year Monitor paid for licences from the Copyright Licensing Agency (CLA) and the Newspaper Licensing Agency (NLA). The CLA licence cost £2,978.40 and the NLA licence cost £8,071.20. Monitor did not pay for any other media licences in 2013/14.

Review rights

If you consider that your request for information has not been properly handled or if you are otherwise dissatisfied with the outcome of your request, you can try to resolve this informally with the person who dealt with your request. If you remain dissatisfied, you may seek an

internal review within Monitor of the issue or the decision. A senior member of Monitor's staff, who has not previously been involved with your request, will undertake that review.


If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of any internal review conducted by Monitor, you may complain to the Information Commissioner for a decision on whether your request for information has been dealt with in accordance with the FOI Act.
