

## Employment of Royal Signals Lt Colonels & Majors on FTRS & ADC contracts Financial years 2008/09 to 2014/15

Question: Could you please provide me with information on the employment of Royal Signals Reserve Majors and Lieutenant Colonels on Full Time Reserve Service (FTRS) contracts for each financial year (April - March) from FY 2008/09 to FY 2014/05. Specifically:

- By rank and year, for each Financial Year from 2008/9 to 2014/15, how many FTRS Full Commitment (FC) contracts were awarded to R Signals Reserve Majors and Lt Cols.
- By rank and year, for each Financial Year from 2008/9 to 2014/15, how many FTRS Limited Commitment (LC) contracts were awarded to R Signals Reserve Majors and Lt Cols.
- By rank and year, for each Financial Year from 2008/9 to 2014/15, how many FTRS Home Commitment (HC) contracts were awarded to R Signals Reserve Majors and Lt Cols.
- By rank and year, for each Financial Year from 2008/9 to 2014/15, how many FTRS Additional Duty Commitment (ADC) contracts were awarded to R Signals Reserve Majors and Lt Cols.

**Notes/Caveats:**  
 The number of new FTRS contracts has been derived from the number of individuals joining the FTRS population. Note that where an individual ends one contract and starts another immediately they will be counted once in the figures above. Where there is a break in service they may be counted twice.  
 The number of new ADC contracts has been derived from the number of people starting an ADC contract.  
 The data have been rounded to the nearest 5 to limit disclosure and ensure confidentiality.  
 Totals and sub-totals have been rounded separately and so may not appear to be the sum of their parts.  
 - = fewer than 5.  
 - = Zero
