SCHOOL TEACHER - NORTHERN IRELAND

This sheet covers both Primary and Secondary teachers in Northern Ireland.

Please see separate occupation sheets for teachers in England, Scotland and Wales.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

School teachers may teach in nursery, primary, secondary or special schools Primary teachers are expected to cover every curriculum subject and some may have a specialism that they develop and teach throughout the school. Secondary school teachers normally specialise in one or two subjects and usually teach these subjects to all age groups (12 to 18) and abilities.

Definitions are as follows:

Overseas Trained Teacher (**OTT**) – someone who has successfully completed a programme of professional teacher training in a country outside the UK that is recognised by the competent authority in that country

Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) – QTS status is awarded by the Department of Education for Northern Ireland to teachers recognised as being qualified to UK standards.

General Teaching Council for No thern Ireland (GTCM) – professional body with which all teachers working in grant-aided schools must register.

INDUSTRY REQUIREMENTS

Grant-aided Schools -

In Northern Iroland, an OTT who gained their qualifications outside the EU must apply to the Department of Education for Northern Ireland and be granted QTS prior to teaching. Before awarding QTS, the Department of Education for Northern Ireland must be satisfied that an OTT's qualifications are at a standard at least equal to that of a UK trained teacher.

Independent Schools -

There is no statutory requirement for a teacher in the private sector to hold QTS or to be registered. The Head Teacher of the school decides which qualifications to accept.

REGISTRATION

Teachers in Northern Ireland must register with the General Teaching Council for Northern Ireland (GTCNI) before being eligible to teach in grant-aided schools. <u>Independent Schools do not need registration.</u>

WORK PERMITS (UK) TREATMENT

B&C

This job meets the skills criteria.

Applications can be approved where the OSN is qualified to teach in their own country, has QTS and is registered with the GTCNI.

This is not a shortage occupation.

TWES

This occupation is not suitable for training or work experience under the TWES criteria, as the applicant will usually be filling a post

SALARY

Maintained Sector -

Qualified Classroom Teachers start on the Main Pay Scale (M1-M6), usually at point M1. The Upper Pay Scale (U1-U3) is performance-based and can only be used once the teacher has reached the top of the Main Pay Scale.

Independent Sector -

There are no set salary scales for teachers in independent schools. Many schools pay similar salaries to those in the state sector, while others pay higher or lower salaries. (The maintained sector pay scale above should be used as a guide.)

TEACHING/CLASSROOM ASSISTANTS

The majority of these posts will <u>not</u> meet the skills criteria, as there are currently no mandatory qualifications for teaching/classroom assistants, however, smay in exceptional circumstances. If in doubt contact the Policy Team.

Exchanges of qualified teachers

There are a number of exchange programmes administered by the British Council's Central Bureau for International Education and Training and the League for the Exchange of Commonwealth Teachers.
