You can talk to us – the back of this leaflet shows you how.



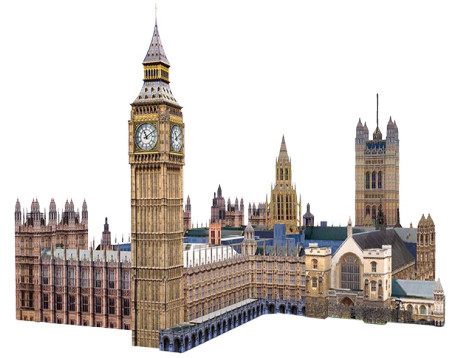
What stage are the plans at?

Connecting people and jobs

HS2 will build 2 new station hubs in London - at Euston and Old Oak Common.

When the new railway is ready, Old Oak Common will be nearly as busy as Waterloo.

HS2, Crossrail, Great Western and Heathrow Express trains will all go from Old Oak Common. London Underground and Overground stations are also near this super-hub. All the changes will bring thousands of new jobs.



Understanding ground conditions

We will contact you if we need to drill a hole to check the ground near you.



£70m to benefit local communities

There is some money to help businesses and community groups near the new railway.

Businesses and community groups can apply for some of this money (£40m in total) through Groundwork UK.

Then there is £30m to make local roads better.
