
Dover to Folkestone MCZ Feature Maps

There are two separate maps, to make it easier to see the locations of features. One map shows the broad-scale habitats, and the second shows features of conservation importance. Broad scale habitats represents habitats, and associated species that live on and in the habitat. Features of conservation importance are specific habitats and species that are known to be rare, threatened or declining in our seas.


