Release of Information

Thank you for your correspondence dated 16 March 2015 requesting information on foreign visits made by the Royal Navy over the last 10 years. Your enquiry has been considered to be a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

I can confirm that the Department holds the following information within the scope of your request.

The Royal Navy averages around 70 Engagement visits each year with a variation of between 40-100. Of these Engagement visits the greatest proportion would be classed as Working Level Influence and Engagement, a proportion as Higher Level Influence and Engagement and the remainder would count as visits made in support of United Kingdom Trade and Investment initiatives. By far the largest proportion of ship visits has been to ports within Europe, followed by the Gulf States, the Caribbean and Africa.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail [CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk](mailto:CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk)). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
