Thank you for your freedom of information request of 24 August 2016. I am writing to confirm that we have now completed our search for the information.

In your email of 24 August you asked the following questions:

- Please confirm what studies you have carried out into the impact of fracking on UK traffic.
- Please supply the results of these studies.

Highways England is responsible for operating, maintaining and improving England's strategic road network which comprises approximately 4,300 miles of motorways and all-purpose trunk roads. The motorways and major roads in England that are managed by the Highways England can be viewed on our Network Management Map: https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/roads-managed-by-the-highways-agency

Other public roads in England are managed by local authorities. Roads in Scotland are managed by Transport Scotland http://www.transportscotland.gov.uk/ and in Wales by the Welsh Government: http://gov.wales/?skip=1&lang=en.

I can confirm that Highways England has not undertaken any studies into the impact of fracking on traffic on the strategic road network. Fracking is taken to mean hydraulic fracturing - a well-stimulation technique in which rock is fractured by a pressurized liquid.
