

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITTING (ENGLAND AND WALES) REGULATIONS 2010

The Environmental Permitting (Linston Ltd) Exercise of Functions Direction 2016

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the power conferred by regulation 33(1)(b) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2010(a), gives the following direction.

Citation and commencement

1. This direction—

- (a) may be cited as the Environmental Permitting (Linston Ltd) Exercise of Functions Direction 2016; and
- (b) comes into force on 26 February 2016.

Interpretation

2.—(1) In this direction—

“premises” means the premises listed in Schedule 1;

“relevant operation” means the storage, treatment and deposit of any of the wastes listed in Schedule 2 at the premises; and

“the 2010 Regulations” means the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2010 as amended.

(2) In Schedule 2 a reference to a waste code is a reference to the corresponding code in the list of wastes established by Commission Decision 2000/532/EC replacing Decision 94/3/EC establishing a list of wastes pursuant to Article 1(a) of Council Directive 75/442/EEC on waste and Council Decision 94/904/EC establishing a list of hazardous waste pursuant to Article 1(4) of Council Directive 91/689/EEC on hazardous waste, as amended.

Exercise of functions

3. Functions under the 2010 Regulations in relation to the relevant operation are exercisable by Derbyshire Dales District Council.

Revocation

4. The Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) (Linston Ltd) Exercise of Functions Direction 2015 is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This direction revokes and replaces with amendments the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) (Linton Ltd) Exercise of Functions Direction 2015.

It directs Derbyshire Dales District Council to exercise functions under the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2010 (S.I. 2010/675) in relation to the storage, treatment and deposit of any of the wastes listed in Schedule 2 at the premises listed in Schedule 1.
