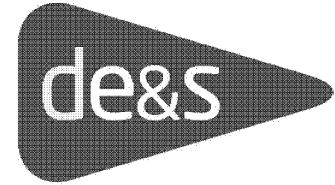

Thank you for your letter of 12th March 2015 requesting the following information:

"I have recently purchased two ex-British Military 9x9 Mk3 Command Post tents together with an adaptor canvas to attach to the rear of my Wolf Land Rovers. I have also obtained a canvas to connect two of these tents together.

I have been unable to source any instructions or other information about the tent or the additional canvas adaptors and their correct method of erection, use and attachment to each other and to a Land Rover. However I noticed that you recently released similar information in part on the larger 12x12 tent under the provisions of the FOIA during the week commencing 16/02/2015. The reference for that document was 8340-C-113-201

I assume therefore that a similar publication or Operating Information exists for the 9x9 Mk3 tents and also for the canvas adaptors I have described above.

Any information you could supply would be gratefully received. Electronic copies of any available information would be preferred but paper copies would be equally acceptable."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

The information you have requested can be found enclosed.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
