Nagoya so if it means leaving Hankyu earlier and not doing pics at Osaka station then we're fine with this.

To your questions:

Thank you very much for your quick response and answers. I now have a clearer picture.

It is good to know that you and the press team inc UK media will arrive in Osaka on Monday afternoon, leaving most of your luggage in Tokyo, which makes things a lot easier.

Regarding your question about Hankyu, yes, Hankyu is open on the Monday. I expect there will be even more shoppers in the store on the day being a public holiday.
