FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

Thank you for your email of 26 April which requested the following information:-

“How many members of Isil/ Daesh have been killed and injured as a result of RAF airstrikes in Syria since they were sanctioned by the House of Commons in December 2015?”

“Of that number, could you break down how many were killed, where and when as a result of a) Brimstone missiles b) Hellfire missiles c) Paveway bombs?”

Your correspondence has been treated as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and the answer to your specific questions can be found below.

We estimate that 22 Daesh combatants have been killed and 5 wounded in action as a result of RAF airstrikes in Syria between 2 December 2015 and 18 May 2016. Please note we are unable to verify this information because the UK cannot visit strike sites and conduct detailed investigations on the ground in Syria. Consequently the number of Daesh killed and/or wounded cannot be determined categorically. It is an estimated figure only. The information you requested is contained in the table below.

Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
