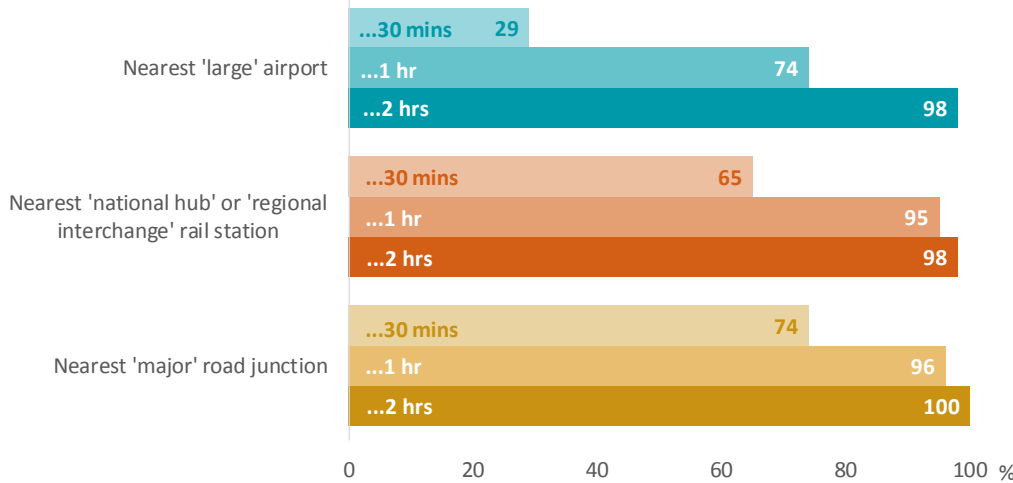




# Connectivity travel times 2013

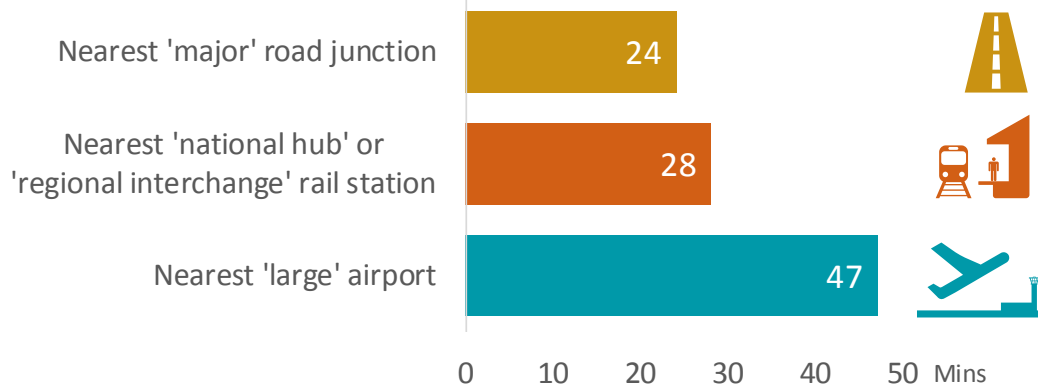
## Proportion of the England population who could reach selected transport destinations by car within...



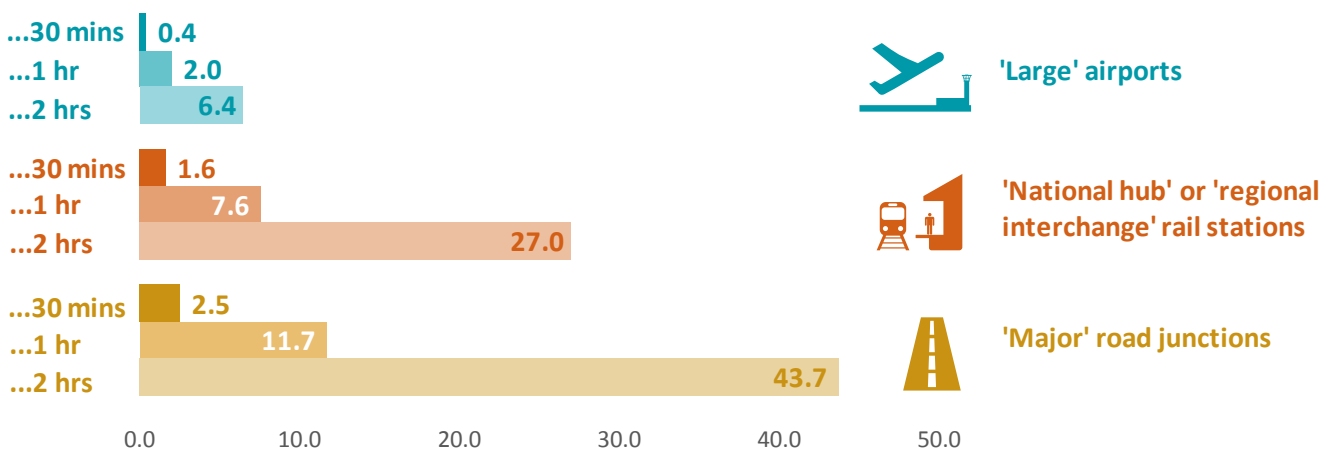
In England in 2013, around 74% of people lived within 1 hour by car of a large airport, about 95% within an hour of a national hub or regional interchange railway station, and about 96% within an hour of a major road junction.

The average travel time to the nearest large airport was 47 minutes, to the nearest major station was 28 minutes, and to the nearest major road junction was 24 minutes.

## England average travel times by car to selected transport destinations during the morning peak, 2013



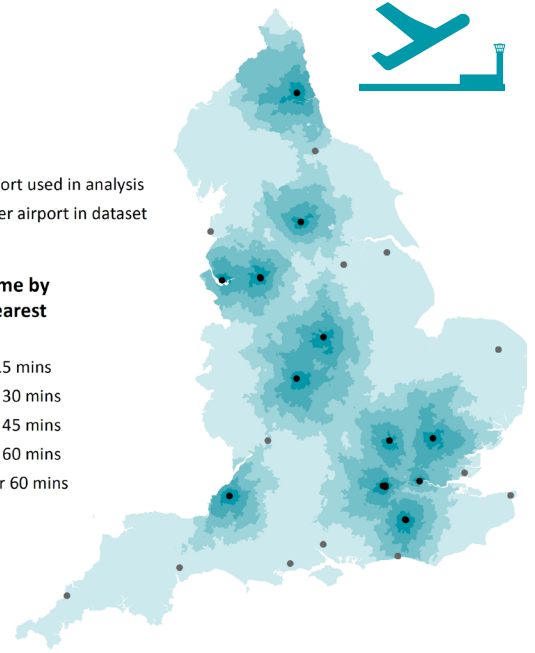
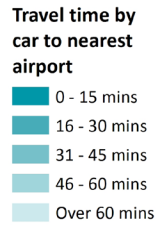
## England average number of destinations accessible within...



## Airports

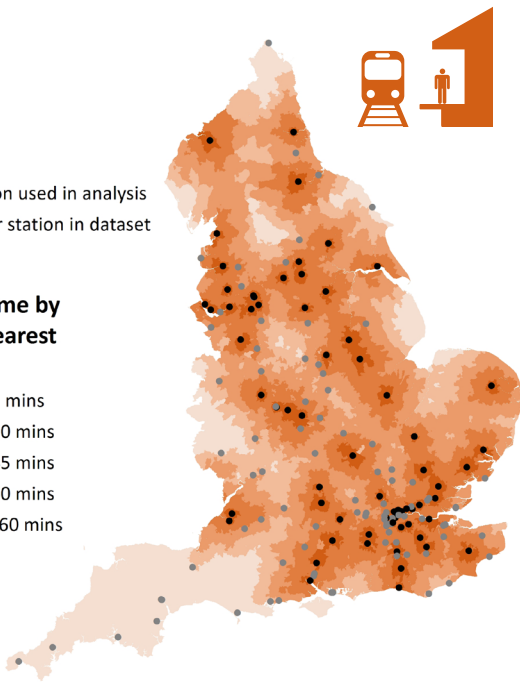
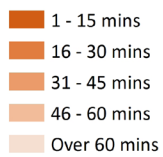
- 'Large' airports means the 15 largest airports by terminal passenger numbers.
- The underlying dataset covers 33 British airports. For Heathrow, Gatwick and Manchester, different terminals are considered as separate destinations.

- Other station in dataset

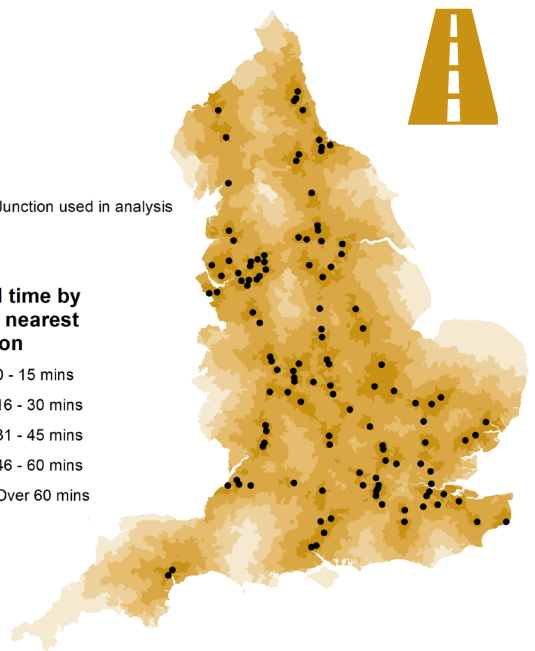
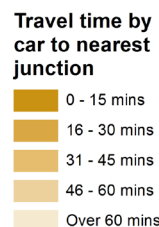
**Travel time by car to nearest station**



## Rail stations

- 'National hubs' and 'regional interchanges' are 88 category A and B stations as defined by Network Rail.
- The underlying dataset covers 183 stations in categories A, B and C1 (important feeder stations: city or busy junction).

## Road junctions

- 'Major road junctions' are 122 intersections of Strategic National Corridors (SNCs) with the Strategic Road Network.
- The underlying dataset covers nearly 500 junctions on the SNCs, where these intersect with the Primary Route Network.
