Hess Limited proposes to drill the Cambo 3 well in block 204/10 approximately	
140km west of Shetland.	
Drilling operations are planned between April and July 2009 and are estimated	
to take approximately 68 days using a dynamically positioned drill ship.	
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Water Based Mud (WBM) will be used, with a total of 940m<sup>3</sup> of mud and 750 tonnes of cuttings being discharged.

Well logging and testing operations are still to be finalised, but for the purposes of the Environmental Statement, there has been an assessment of the impacts from well logging operations which may include vertical seismic profiling (VSP) and a conventional well test. The operation of the airguns used for the VSP operations will be conducted in accordance with the JNCC guidelines for minimisation of effects on small cetaceans. When carrying out a conventional well test, Hess will ensure that no more than 2000 tonnes of oil will be produced, within a period not exceeding a total of 96 hours, in order to make sure it will not qualify as an 'extended well test' (EWT).

Depending on the hydrocarbons found, the well will either be suspended or abandoned.

As a result of an environmental risk assessment there were the following potentially significant aspects identified and addressed within the ES:

- > Physical presence
- Noise Generation
- Atmospheric Emissions
- Drilling Discharges
- Hydrocarbon spills
- > Transboundary impacts
- Cumulative impacts

Mitigation measures are in place to ensure that impacts are kept to a minimum.

Recommendation: Based on the information in the Environmental Statement, it is recommended that project consent be given. **Consultees:** JNCC: JNCC commented that the ES was lacking in terms of detailed survey information and requested further information. Further information was received from Hess on 18/12/2008. JNCC confirmation that they have no objections, DTI Offshore Petroleum Activities (Conservation of Habitats) Regulations 2001 considered and no significant effects likely. No objections. Commented on the high FRS standard of the Environmental Statement.
