Thank you for your email of 1 July 2015 which requested the following information:-

“Please can I request under the Freedom of Information Act, for each month between Apr and June 2015, and broken down between Iraq and Syria,

- a) the number of Reaper missions flown;*
- b) the number of sorties with weapons released;*
- c) the number and type of weapons released*

Please can you let me have the number of UK air strikes in Iraq since March 2015 broken down between Tornado and Reaper aircraft.”

Your correspondence has been treated as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and your specific questions are answered below.
