I am writing in response to your request for information regarding the below received on 20 April 2015. Your request has been handled under Section 1(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. In accordance with Section 1(1)(a) of the Act I hereby confirm that the CNC/CNPA does hold information of the type specified.

Due to the complexities and timescales of this request, the information provided is to the best of the CNC knowledge.

The amount of Police Officers in the employ of the CNPA who have been absence from the workplace due to sickness, which is described on their fit note provided by their GP or Consultant as "Work related Stress" from 2010 to the present date.

Since 2010 to the present day, HR have informed us that fit notes referring to work related stress have been received from 44 police officers

The amount of Police Staff in the employ of the CNPA who have been absence from the workplace due to sickness, which is described on their fit note provided by their GP or Consultant as "Work related Stress" from 2010 to the present date.

Since 2010 to the present day, HR have informed us that fit notes referring to work related stress have been received from 11 police staff.

The amount of Police Officers in the employ of the CNPA who have been absence from the workplace due to sickness, which is described on their fit note provided by their GP or Consultant as "Work related Stress" from 2010 to the present date.,and this diagnosis has been accepted by their employer the CNPA

The CNC has always accepted the medical diagnosis that the police officer was suffering from stress and on no occasion has this been challenged.

Of completed investigations, in 1 case the CNC has additionally accepted that the HSE threshold of excessive pressure was exceeded.

The amount of Police Staff in the employ of the CNPA who have been absence from the workplace due to sickness, which is described on their fit note provided by their GP or

Consultant as "Work related Stress" from 2010 to the present date.,and this diagnosis has been accepted by their employer the CNPA

The CNC has always accepted the medical diagnosis that the police staff was suffering from stress and on no occasion has this been challenged.

Of completed investigations, in 4 cases the CNC has additionally accepted that the HSE threshold of excessive pressure was exceeded.

We take our responsibilities under the Freedom of Information Act seriously but, if you feel your request has not been properly handled or you are otherwise dissatisfied with the outcome of your request, you have the right to complain.
