A list of all meetings held by Alan Duncan in his capacity as Special Envoy for Yemen from March 2015 to the present.

Below provides details to accompany the FOI reply.

23 July 2015 - Met with Amer Daoudi, UN Regional Humanitarian Co-ordinator for Yemen.

8 September 2015 – Meeting with NGO's; Saferworld, Oxfam, Amnesty International and Crisis Action.

16-17 September 2015 – Visited Saudi Arabia. Calls on G18 Ambassadors, Saudi Foreign Minister Adel al-Jubeir, Yemeni President Hadi, Members of Saudi Arabia Defence and Security Staff, UN Special Envoy for Yemen, Ismail Ould Cheikh Ahmed and Head of the King Salman Centre for Humanitarian Affairs, Dr Abdallah Al Rabeeah.

18-20 September 2015 – Visited Muscat. Met with Head of the Royal Office, General Sultan Nu'mani and Foreign Minister, Yusuf bin Alawi. Also saw Deputy Foreign Minister Sayyid Badr and former Yemeni Foreign Minister, Abu Bakr al-Qirbi.

21 September 2015 – Visited UAE. Meetings with Minister for International Cooperation and Development, HE Sheikha Lubna Al Qasimi, the National Security Council and Deputy Foreign Minister Dr Anwar Gargash.

12 October 2015 – Meeting with Médecins Sans Frontière (MSF).

6 April 2016 – Visited Saudi Arabia. Meetings with Yemeni Vice President Ali Mohsen, Yemeni President Hadi, Yemeni Foreign Minister Abdulmalik Al-Mekhlafi and various members of the Yemeni Cabinet. Met with members of the House of Saud; King Salman, Crown Prince and Deputy Crown Prince and also met Saudi Foreign Minister Adel al-Jubeir.

16-17 May 2016 – Visited Saudi Arabia and met with, GCC Secretary General Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani, Yemeni President Hadi, Yemeni Vice President Ali Mohsen, Yemeni Prime Minister Ahmed Bin Dagher and Secretary General for the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation, Iyad Madani. Also met Saudi Defence and Security staff and shown the Evacuation and Humanitarian Operations Centre.

18 May 2016 - Visited Abu Dhabi met with US Ambassador.
