Thank you for your email of 6 June 2016 requesting the following information:

"Please supply the names of all of members of staff at Capita or the Defence Infrastructure Organisation [DIO] involved in the evaluation of the tender for a development partner for the Prince Philip Barracks and for each:

"a. Provide their job title and a brief description of their role in the project

"b. Specify whether they were directly employed by the DIO or Capita at the time."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that all the information in scope of your request is held.

The information you have requested can be found below but some of the information falls entirely within the scope of the absolute exemptions provided for at Section 40 (Personal Data) and has been withheld. Section 40(2) has been applied to some of the information in order to protect personal information as governed by the Data Protection Act 1998. Section 40 is an absolute exemption and there is therefore no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold the information.

No Capita employees were involved in the evaluation of the tenders. Three members of the DIO were involved in evaluating the Tenders. Their job titles and roles were:

- DIO Comrcl 3e Assistant Head, role in evaluation was: Procurement, Commercial and Legal
- DIO ASP-Acq Disposal6, role in evaluation was: Disposal, Planning and Strategic Issues
- DIO ASP-Acq Disposal6a, role in evaluation was: Estate Surveyor, Site Information, Technical & Decant Issues

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act.
