While compiling their details in one place may seem a positive move in terms of targeting services, this could very easily lead to stigmatisation of those in debt.

Finally, proposals for bulk sharing of birth, marriage and death data should be removed - this is an unnecessary invasion of privacy.

Centralising information about people in debt to Government only makes sense if it helps increase recovery and reduce hardship. Current proposals need to be dropped and reconsidered as part of a broader strategy on debt.

BIRTH, MARRIAGE AND DEATH DATA

There is also a plan for the bulk sharing across government of data from the General Registry Office, who hold certificates for births, deaths and marriages. Despite repeated reassurance from government to the contrary, the sharing of these common identifiers across government has is a lightweight version of ID Cards. These plans should also be dropped.

This should be enshrined in the system that you use to share the data. There need to be appropriate safeguards for misuse and auditing it will help keep people honest who use it and if there is any kind of breach then it ought to be easy to find.

The register of people in debt is an unnecessary use of the data. This should be dropped. Vulnerable members of our society are likely to be the ones that lose out if this system is implemented. Please protect our most vulnerable citizens. There are no clear indications how a central database for this helps people reduce debt.

There need to be adequate safeguards in place to ensure the datasets are not used in any way to stigmatise parts of our community. There needs to be transparency over who has access and who has the oversight and where the authority lies for keeping the data safe from anyone that would abuse it and assurances that misuse of the data would have appropriate consequences.

If this is to be a government system then there should be no third party access to the data under any circumstances. Assurances that our data will be kept private must be made.
