- 3. Statistical group is a hierarchical variable. A person who fits into more than one category will only appear in the top-most one for which they are eligible. For example a claimant of Disability Living Allowance and Jobseekers Allowance would appear in "Job seeker", not in "Disabled". For more information see Annex A.
- 4. From November 2008 the "Incapacity benefits group" includes Employment and Support Allowance (ESA). ESA replaced Incapacity Benefit and Income Support paid on the grounds of incapacity for new claims from 27 October 2008. Prior to this the "Incapacity benefits group" referred to claimants of Incapacity Benefit (including credits only) or Severe Disablement Allowance including people claiming Income Support on the grounds of incapacity.

In response to part C of your request, ad hoc analysis was published on the Department's website on 13 May 2011 which shows Housing Benefit claimants in and out of work, by age and region at December 2010. See table 3:

Table 6 includes information on passported benefits which give automatic entitlement to Housing Benefit. Passported benefits include Income Support, Jobseeker's Allowance (income-based), Employment and Support Allowance (income-based) and Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit). The table also provides information on recipients that are non-passported (standard claims) in employment. Table 8 includes information on Housing Benefit recipients by age group, including age 65 and over.

The table at annex A provides a further breakdown of table 6 for the London region, at August 2010 and April 2011, which is the latest available information.
