

What official visits, meetings or other diary engagements did Phillip Hammond undertake in his capacity as Ministerial Flood Representative for the Thames Valley while Secretary of State at the Ministry of Defence?

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm, that some information in scope of your request is held. Our records show that the Defence Secretary had 10 diary engagements in the department in his role as Ministerial flood representative from 14 February to 14 July 2015. We are also aware that Mr Hammond has had six further meetings since he became Foreign Secretary.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
