### **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: DETAILS OF POLICE VEHICLES INVOLVED IN TRAFFIC COLLISIONS**

We refer to your email dated 6 January 2016 which was acknowledged on 13 January 2016.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email you requested the following information:

**“How many police vehicles have been involved in traffic collisions over the last three financial years? Please break down by 2012-13, 2013-14, and 2014-15.**

**Please also break down by:**

- i) how many of these incidents occurred during emergency calls, and how many did not.**
- ii) how many injuries and fatalities were caused, and whether these were police officers, or members of the public**
- iii) the financial cost of repair to vehicles, and whether the vehicle was written off**

**The information I wish to receive also relates to incidents where one of your vehicles was involved in an collision where the vehicle was not damaged (but, for instance, where someone may have been injured, or another vehicle or property was damaged).**

**To add - by 'collisions' - I mean bumps and scrapes with objects and people, as well as other vehicles.”**

A search for information has now been completed and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held.

**How many police vehicles have been involved in traffic collisions over the last three financial years? Please break down by 2012-13, 2013-14, and 2014-15.**

**i) how many of these incidents occurred during emergency calls, and how many did not.**

No information held. Emergency calls cannot be picked up by the report writing application that generates the figures and this information may also be omitted in the original paperwork.

**ii) how many injuries and fatalities were caused, and whether these were police officers, or members of the public**

3 injuries involving MDP officers were caused.

**iii) the financial cost of repair to vehicles, and whether the vehicle was written off**

No information held.

If you are not satisfied with this response or wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate the case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
