SEN

- DCYP involvement in drafting parts of 2014 Code
- Changes to SCE procedures overseas
- DCYP (CEAS) case work

Pupil Information Profile (PIP)

- Information template for all mobile Service children
- Mentioned as MoD resource in 2014 SEN Code but not exclusively a SEN document
- SCE Schools overseas required to use it
- Not mandatory in UK
- Implementation challenges

Service Pupil Premium

- £300 per Service Child per annum
- DfE to publish further examples of good practice
- England only
- Rationale? Future?

Education Support Fund

- £6M per year until end of financial year 2017 2018
- Schools and local authorities UK wide
- Re basing focus

Rebasing:

Approximate 10,800 to move (Germany – UK / UK – UK)

Term - time absence

- Headteachers' responsibility / discretion to authorise in 'exceptional circumstances'
- No DfE guidance around 'exceptional circumstances'
- NAHT guidance (Autumn 2014)
- MOD (DfE?) guidance shortly
