<p>2. LANCS Dress Proposal</p>	<p>a. Col presented the draft proposal at Annex A and outlined the historical background as follows:</p> <p>All proposals presented to the ADC had been approved by the Formation Committee (FC) of the Regiment – Cols of Regts, COs, RSMs and Regt Secs of the 3 Regiments including TA Bns (LCV and KCR) – and in turn Regimental proposals to the FC were the result of wide consultation within the Regiments.</p> <p>The new Regiment covers an area from Liverpool to Carlisle west of the Pennines and encompasses 12 former Regiments of Foot (4<sup>th</sup> to 96<sup>th</sup>) and 7 old County Regiments. Two of the Regiments are very old Royal Regiments with the third, the KINGS entitled to the trappings of a Royal Regiment since 1716.</p> <p>The vital ground for each regiment was different:</p> <p>For KORBR it was the Lion of England and recognition of the Border heritage  For KINGS it was the title KINGSMAN and the Fleur de Lys  For QLR it was the red rose of Lancashire, central to the new Regiments identity.</p> <p>In coming to their proposal they have preserved what they believe is important, what is unique and stylish. These proposals represent but a small part of the overall merger with many other elements just as vital – the location of RHQ, the Crest, the insignia on the Colours, the title KINGSMAN now confirmed as the title for all private soldiers. All that we carry forward has a link to the former, the 'golden thread', as we form a new regiment with a single identity and ethos from 3 famous, proud and very different Regiments. Throughout the proposals will appear:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Our cap badge based on 3 elements – the Red Rose surrounded by the Fontenoy wreath and surmounted by the motto of the KINGS.</li> <li>• Our collar dogs based on the Lion of England</li> </ul>	<p>APPROVED Decision 4065 (less serials 4,18,36,38 and 41 in Annex A)</p>	<p>King's Div  Col  LANCS team  DC IPT  HQ LAND</p>

<p>3. YORKS Dress Proposal</p>	<p>a. The presentation given by the King's Div is shown at Annex B. and was preceded by an explanation of the rationale adopted for the proposal as follows:</p> <p>In forming the new Regiment the existing regiments of Yorkshire had focused on the future rather than the past. The intent had been the successful formation of a well recruited, well manned and operationally capable regiment that acknowledge the past achievements of its forebears, carries forward their traditions, standards and values, whilst embracing the future with confidence. In terms of dress and distinctions the intent had been to keep alive, as far as possible and give weight to the three antecedent regiments which were represented in the new regiment.</p> <p>A formation committee had been established by the Colonels under the chairmanship of Brigadier Dennis, Comd 15 (NE) Bde with membership from each of the existing regiments. This formation committee reported to the Colonels for confirmation of all decisions regarding dress and distinctions. Deliberations on dress had been relatively straight forward as the committee had sought to meet the Colonels intent.</p>	<p>APPROVED Decision 4066 (less serial 38 in Annex B)</p>	<p>King's Div YORKS DC IPT HQ LAND</p>

**DRESS PROPOSAL**  
**THE DUKE OF LANCASTER'S REGIMENT**  
**(King's, Lancashire and Border)**

Ser	Order of Dress/Item	Description	Remarks
1	Cap Badge	Red Rose of Lancaster charged with the Royal Crown, surrounded by a Fontenoy Laurel Wreath, with motto 'Nec Aspera Terrent' on scroll beneath Rose. The badge to be matt gold with polished highlights, the Rose in red enamel (as QLR badge). Height 4.5 cm, width 4.3 cm.	The central Red Rose of Lancaster and Royal Crown are derived from present QLR badge, to which has been added a Fontenoy Laurel Wreath, for KORBR, and the present KINGS motto. The Laurel Wreath is a distinction of 34 <sup>th</sup> Foot (later 1 <sup>st</sup> Border) dating from 1745 while the motto, which has been adopted by LANCS, was conferred on the KINGS, together with the White Horse of Hanover and Blue facings, in 1716.
2	<u>No. 1 Dress</u> Forage Hat	Royals, Regimental cap badge and small (22 line) buttons.	KORBR and QLR are Royal Regiments, KINGS have always been entitled to 'Royal' facings, etc, and all three currently wear Royals Forage Caps.
3	Uniform	Blue, Infantry pattern with 9 medium (30 line) mounted buttons (15 for officers, who wear three buttons on each cuff). OR wear Deep Green epaulette piping. Adjutants and Field Officers wear overalls	The third cuff button is an old BORDER custom currently perpetuated by KORBR. The three buttons are worn in a triangular pattern, with the third button to the rear.  Deep Green is currently the KINGS piping colour and similar dark shades of Green are Regimental colours of KORBR and QLR.  ADC Comment: agreed but piping to be scarlet.

6	Collar Badges	The Lion of England in silver, 5.2 cm long (as present KORBR pattern). The Lions are inward facing. Fastened with two shanks and a split-pin.	It is a Regimental tradition that King William III granted the badge in recognition of the 4 <sup>th</sup> being one of the first to join him in 1688. It is referred to in the Royal Warrant of 1751 as the Regiment's 'ancient badge' and has been worn on uniform badges and buttons since at least circa 1774.  ADC Comment: new badge to have clutch and pin fastening.
7	Rank Badges	Officers: Bath Star ¾ size plain bright metal, plain crown. OR: Gold badges & chevrons on Red.	OR may also wear qualification badges and good conduct chevrons, the latter on a dark blue backing.
8	Parade Belt (OR)	White Corlene plastic belt with Union Locket. Central device: Sphinx super scribed 'Egypt' within a Fontenoy Laurel Wreath, Royal Crown above and small	The Sphinx is the most widespread of our Regimental Distinctions (8 <sup>th</sup> , 30 <sup>th</sup> , 40 <sup>th</sup> & 96 <sup>th</sup> ), but does not feature elsewhere on our accoutrements; Fontenoy Wreath for 34 <sup>th</sup> /BORDER.
